ACT TO AMEND THE LAW WITH RESPECT OFFENCES AGAINST PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN, AND WITH RESPECT TO PENALTIES UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW AMEND-MENT ACT, 1885.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE OIREACHTAS OF SAORSTAT EIREANN AS FOLLOWS:-

Consent of young person to be no defence.

1.-It shall be no defence to a charge or indictment for an indecent assault on a child or young person under the age of eighteen to prove that he or she consented to the act of indecency. 15

- Amendment of ss. 5 and 6 of 48 and 49 Vict. c. 69 as to defence of reasonable belief.
- 2.—Reasonable cause to believe that a girl was of or above the age of eighteen years shall not be a defence to a charge under sections 5 or 6 of the Criminal Law Amendment Act, 1885 (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act). The limit of time mentioned in the second proviso to section 5 of the Principal Act, as 20 amended by section 27 of the Prevention of Crucky to Children Act, 1904, shall be nine months after the commission of the offence: Provided that in the case of a man of twenty-three years of age or under the presence of reasonable cause to believe that the girl was over the age of eighteen years shall be a valid defence 25 on the first occasion on which he is charged with an offence under this section.

Amendment of penalties under section 13 of Principal Act.

- 3.—Any person who is convicted of an offence against section 13 of the Principal Act (which relates to summary proceedings against brothel keepers, etc.) shall be liable on summary convic- 30 tion :-
 - (a) to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three months; and
 - (b) on a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not ex- 35 ceeding two hundred and fifty pounds or to imprison-ment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months;

or, in any such case, to both fine and imprisonment.

Repeals.

4.- The enactments specified in the first and second columns of 40 the Schedule to this Act shall be repealed to the extent shown in the third column of that Schedule.

Short title.

5 .- This Act may be cited as the Criminal Law Amendment Act, 1930; and the Criminal Law Amendment Acts 1885 to 1912 and this Act may be cited together as the Criminal Law Amend- 45 ment Acts 1885 to 1930.
