#### EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Since 1922 the law relating to local government has undergone considerable change; the number of local authorities has been reduced and new methods of administration have been adopted. Provisions dealing with services such as public assistance and roads have been recast and new procedures for the appointment and control of officers and the purchase of supplies have been put into operation.

These changes have rendered many of the existing statutory provisions relating to local government unnecessary.

The purpose of the Bill is to repeal provisions in local government statutes which are spent, obsolete or otherwise unnecessary. The reasons for the repeal of the provisions set out in the schedule to the Bill are as follows:

(Where only sections or words in sections of an Act will be repealed a reference is given to the section.)

GRAND JURY (IRELAND) ACT, 1816.

Regulated proceedings of grand juries on bills of indictment.

Obsolete. (See section 27, Courts of Justice Act, 1924.)

Grand Jury (Ireland) Act, 1836 (as adapted by the Local Government (Adaptation of Irish Enactments) Order, 1899).

These sections relating to grand juries are obsolete (see Sections 29, 31, 32 preceding note on Grand Jury (Ireland) Act, 1816, and as to 33, 34 and 36. sheriffs see section 52 Court Officers Act, 1926).

Refers to requirement that an assistant county surveyor be Section 43.

certified by the persons appointed for that purpose by the Lord
Lieutenant. Obsolete.

The offices of clerk of the peace and clerk of the crown have Section 46. been abolished.

The Procedure of Councils Order, 1899 under which proposal Section 78 committees were formed was revoked by the Public Bodies Order, 1925.

Section 79 is repealed as to courthouses (see Courthouses Sections 79 and (Provision and Maintenance) Act, 1935). The cost of interpreters (section 79) and of gallows, bolts and shackles (section 80) are not now met out of the rates. Provisions as to traffic signs are covered by section 69 of Local Government Act, 1946, and as to depots by section 10 of the Local Government Act, 1898.

No county fever hospitals exist except in Cork. The proviso Section 82, is required pending the coming into force of Part III of Cork Fever Hospital Act, 1935.

Provision for building a fever hospital is now covered by Section 84. section 10 of the Health Act, 1947.

Refers to proposal committees. See note on section 78.

Section 93. Repaying advances from Consolidated Fund for building and maintaining district mental hospitals. Spent.

Section 105. The abolition of grand juries, rural district councils and proposal committees makes the words to be repealed obsolete.

Provided for monetary payments to any person who apprehends and prosecutes to conviction murderers and other felons. By the Criminal Justice (Administration) Act, 1924, all criminal charges prosecuted upon indictment shall be prosecuted by the Attorney General. With reference to proposal committees see note on section 78. A sentence of transportation cannot now be imposed.

Sections 110, 112 Courthouse keepers are dealt with by Courthouses (Provision and Maintenance) Act, 1935. Court Criers are no longer paid out of the rates. The other officials to whom reference is made in Schedule (S) annexed to these sections do not now exist. Section 113 depends on Schedule (S) which will be repealed.

Section 114. Presentments for the secretaries of the grand juries to cover stationery. Obsolete.

Section 117. See note on section 78.

Section 120. Power to purchase ferries. Now covered by Ferries (Acquisition by Local Authorities) Act, 1919.

Relates to Bridges (Ireland) Act, 1834, repealed by Local Government Act, 1946.

Section 143. Imperative and grand jury presentments to be printed separately. Obsolete.

Section 165. Reference to grand jury presentment. Obsolete.

Section 168. Proceedings for breach of contract. The jurisdiction of courts now depends on Courts of Justice Act, 1924.

Section 172 Affidavits under the Act. Obsolete.

Section 174. Unnecessary. Schedules to part of the Act. No schedules now survive.

Section 180. Reference to grand jury presentment. Obsolete.

Section 26. All incorporated sections previously repealed except section 11 of Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847, which will be repealed by this Bill.

Section 30. Appointment of clerk covered by Local Government Act 1941, section 10. Residue of section repealed by Courthouses (Provision and Maintenance) Act, 1935.

Section 31. The incorporated provisions relate to officers and are now in effect repealed by the Local Government Act, 1941, Part II. See note on sections 6 to 12 of the Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847.

Section 36. Towns under Town Commissioners now incur no expenditure on repair or maintenance of roads under these powers. See note on sections 51 to 53 of the Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847.

Section 37. Incorporation of sections of Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847. The incorporated sections (57 to 63) are repealed by this Bill.

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Incorporated sections (84 to 85 of the Towns Improvement Section 40. Clauses Act, 1847) are repealed by this Bill.

Party walls: provisions replaced by bye-laws under Public Section 43. Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, section 41 (2).
