The purpose of this Bill is to confirm Emergency Imposition of Duties (No.260) Order, 1951 and Emergency Imposition of Duties (No.261) Order, 1951. These Orders were made by the Government on the 20th April, 1951, and the 3rd May, 1951, respectively under the Emergency Imposition of Duties Act, 1932.

Emergency Imposition of Duties (No.260) Order, 1951.

This Order, which came into operation on the 27th April 1951, imposed a Customs duty of 45% ad valorem, full rate, 30% ad valorem, preferential rate (for goods of U.K. or Canadian origin) on the following articles:-

Abrasives, which consist of abrasive powder or grain on a base of -

- (a) paper, or
- (b) paperboard, or
- (c) cloth, or
- (d) paper and cloth, or
- (e) paperboard and cloth,

imported in sheets, rolls or coils, or in the form of belts or discs but excluding any such abrasives -

- (i) which have been waterproofed or
- (ii) which are discs having a vulcanised base.

Emergency Imposition of Duties (No.261) Order, 1951.

This Order, which came into operation on the 10th May, 1951, imposed the following Customs duty:-

Emergency Imposition of Duties (No.248) Order, 1950, was amended so as to exclude hacksaw blades from the scope of the duty imposed by that Order. Hacksaw blades hitherto liable to duty were brought within the scope of the duty imposed by Emergency Imposition of Duties (No.261) Order, 1951.

The purpose of this Bill is to confirm the Emergency Importation of Butter (No. 2) Order, 1951, and to provide for the imposition of a Customs duty on butter imported from certain countries. The Order was made on the 10th April, 1951, and the Bill was introduced in the House of Commons on the 11th April, 1951.

Emergency Importation of Butter (No. 2) Order, 1951

This Order, which came into operation on the 10th April, 1951, imposed a Customs duty of 10% on butter imported from certain countries, and provided for the imposition of a Customs duty on the following articles:
