AN ACT TO APPLY A CERTAIN SUM OUT OF THE 5
CENTRAL FUND TO THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR
ENDING ON THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF MARCH,
ONE THOUSAND, NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-
FOUR, TO APPROPRIATE TO THE PROPER SUPPLY 10
SERVICES AND PURPOSES THE SUMS GRANTED BY
THE CENTRAL FUND ACT, 1953, THE CENTRAL FUND
(NO. 2) ACT, 1953, AND THIS ACT, AND TO MAKE
CERTAIN PROVISION IN RELATION TO BORROWING. 15

BE IT ENACTED BY THE OIREACHTAS AS FOLLOWS :—

GRANTS OUT OF THE CENTRAL FUND. 15

1.—The Minister for Finance may issue out of the Central
Fund and apply towards making good the supply granted for the
service of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March,
one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, the sum of thirty-one
million, sixty-three thousand, five hundred and eighty-nine pounds. 20

Power of the

borrow up to

2.—(1) The Minister for Finance may borrow from any person
and the Bank of Ireland may advance to the Minister for Finance
any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole thirty-one million,
sixty-three thousand, five hundred and eighty-nine pounds, and for
the purpose of such borrowing the Minister for Finance may create 25
and issue any securities bearing such rate of interest and subject
to such conditions as to repayment, redemption or otherwise, as he
thinks fit.

(2) The principal and interest of any securities issued under
this Act and the expenses incurred in connection with the issue 30
of such securities shall be charged on the Central Fund or the
growing produce thereof.

(3) Any moneys raised by securities issued under this Act shall
be placed to the credit of the account of the Exchequer and shall
form part of the Central Fund and be available in any manner 35
in which such Fund is available.

3.—(1) All sums granted by this Act and the other Acts
mentioned in Schedule (A) annexed to this Act out of the Central
Fund towards making good the supply granted, amounting, as 40
appears by the said Schedule, in the aggregate to the sum of
one hundred and eleven million, three hundred and thirteen

thousand, four hundred and eighty-four pounds, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Acts mentioned in the said Schedule (A) for the services and purposes expressed in Schedule (B) annexed thereto. The abstract of schedules and schedules annexed thereto, with the note (if any) to such schedules shall be deemed to be part of this Act in the same manner as if they had been contained in the body thereof.

(2) In addition to the grants out of the Central Fund referred to in the foregoing subsection of this section, there may be applied out of any money directed under section 2 of the Public Accounts and Charges Act, 1891, to be applied as appropriations-in-aid of the grants for the services and purposes specified in Schedule (B) annexed hereto, the sums respectively set forth in the last column of the said Schedule amounting, as appears thereby in the aggregate to the sum of four million, three hundred and seven thousand, nine hundred and sixty-eight pounds.

4.—This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1953. Short title.
