

BILLE IASCAIGH AN FHEABHAIL (LEASÚ), 1981 FOYLE FISHERIES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1981

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

- 1. The object of this Bill is to make provision for increased penalties in respect of offences under the Foyle Fisheries Acts, 1952 to 1976.
- 2. Section 1 defines terms which are of general application throughout the Bill.
- 3. Section 2 provides that a person charged with an offence under section 35 or 49 of the Foyle Fisheries Act, 1952, may be tried on indictment and shall, on conviction on indictment, be liable to a fine not exceeding £2,000, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years, or to both such fine and such imprisonment.
- 4. Sections 3 and 4 provide for increased penalties under the Foyle Fisheries Acts, 1952 to 1976. Details of the existing penalties and the proposed increased penalties are set out in the following Table.

5. Section 5 sets out the short title etc. of the Bill. In addition it provides that the Minister for Fisheries and Forestry shall, by order, appoint the day on which the Bill, when enacted, shall come into operation.
