# BILT.

AN ACT TO RENDER NULL AND VOID GIFTS MADE 5 UNDER A WILL TO THE MEDICAL PRACTITIONER OF A TESTATOR.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE OIREACHTAS AS FOLLOWS:

**1.**—(1) This Act may be cited as the Succession Act, 2000.

Short title, collective citation and construction.

- 10 (2) This Act and the Succession Act, 1965, may be cited together as the Succession Acts, 1965 to 2000, and shall be construed together as one Act.
- 2.—(1) Any devise, bequest, estate, interest, gift, or appointment, Gifts to medical of or affecting any property (other than charges and directions for the payment of any debt or debts) given or made by a will to a person 15 the payment of any debt or debts) given or made by a will to a person who is, at the time of execution of the will, the medical practitioner of the testator or the spouse of that medical practitioner shall, so far only as concerns that medical practitioner or his or her spouse, or any person claiming under either of them, be utterly null and void.

- (2) Subsection (1) shall not apply in respect of a medical practitioner who is-
  - (a) a brother or sister of the testator or of his or her spouse, or a child of such brother or sister,
  - (b) a parent or grandparent of the testator or of his or her spouse,
  - (c) a spouse of the testator, or

- (d) a child or grandchild of the testator or of his or her spouse.
- (3) In this section "medical practitioner" means a medical practitioner within the meaning of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1978.

### **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

Purpose of Bill

The purpose of the Bill is to render null and void any gift made under a will to the medical practitioner of a testator or to the spouse of that medical practitioner.

### Provisions of Bill

Section 1 contains standard provisions relating to the short title of the Bill, collective citation and construction.

Section 2 provides that any devise, bequest, estate, interest, gift, or appointment, of or affecting any property given or made by a will to a person who is, at the time of execution of the will, the medical practitioner of the testator or the spouse of that medical practitioner shall, so far only as concerns that medical practitioner or his or her spouse, or any person claiming under either of them, be utterly null and void.

This rule shall not apply in respect charges or directions for the payment of debts due and owing to the medical practitioner. Nor shall it apply in respect of a medical practitioner who is a member of the testator's immediate family.
