SECTION 3

1. In page 7, before section 3, to insert the following new section:

"Amendment to the Principal Act.

- 3.—(1) The Principal Act is amended in section 53(2)—
 - (a) in paragraph (a) by the substitution of "fine," for "fine and",
 - (b) in paragraph (b) by the substitution of "imprisonment and," for "imprisonment.", and
 - (c) by the insertion of the following paragraph in subsection (2):
 - "(c) and in any case shall be liable to a mandatory disqualification from driving for a period of not less than 6 months and not more than 3 years."
- (2) In this section, "Principal Act" means the Road Traffic Act 1961.".

- **2.** In page 7, before section 3, to insert the following new section:

"Road Traffic Consolidation Act.

3.—The Minister shall, as soon as is practicable, begin the process of producing a Road Traffic Consolidation Act that will act as a consolidated statute of all road traffic legislation.".

3. In page 7, before section 3, to insert the following new section:

"Power to make bye-laws as to parking.

- 3.—(1) A local authority may make a bye-law under Part 19 of the Local Government Act 2001, to regulate parking for mechanically propelled vehicles in a specific area within its functional area.
 - (2) Such bye-law shall specify—
 - (a) the specific area covered by the bye-law,
 - (b) the persons or category of persons who are covered by the bye-law,
 - (c) the occasions on which the bye-law shall be in force,
 - (d) the length of time for which the bye-law shall be in force on each occasion, and

- (e) such other factors as the Local Authority may deem appropriate.
- (3) A local authority shall exercise its functions under this section where it deems it necessary to restrict parking referred to in *subsection* (1) to residents of the specific area only.".
