AN ACT TO PROMOTE THE REVISION OF STATUTE LAW BY REPEALING CERTAIN STATUTES OF A SPECIFIED SERIES THAT WERE ENACTED ON OR BEFORE 31 DECEMBER 1750 AND CERTAIN OTHER STATUTES OF ANOTHER SPECIFIED SERIES THAT WERE ENACTED 10 ON OR BEFORE 31 DECEMBER 1850 AND WHICH HAVE CEASED TO HAVE EFFECT OR HAVE BECOME UNNECESSARY, BY IDENTIFYING THOSE STATUTES THAT WERE SO ENACTED BUT ARE NOT BEING REPEALED BY THIS ACT, BY ASSIGNING SHORT 15 TITLES TO CERTAIN STATUTES IN ORDER TO FACILI-TATE THEIR CITATION AND BY AMENDING CERTAIN STATUTES IN SO FAR AS THEY RELATE TO SHORT TITLES, AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE OIREACHTAS AS FOLLOWS:

20 1.—In this Act—

Definitions.

"local and personal Act" means a statute enacted as a local and personal Act, or published in any official series of local and personal Acts (howsoever described);

- "private Act" means a statute enacted as a private Act, or published in any official series of private Acts (howsoever described);
 - "P.R.O. vol. 3" has the same meaning that it has for the purposes of the Schedules to the Statute Law Revision Act 2007 as provided for in section 8(1)(a)(ix) of that Act;
- "relevant statute" means a local and personal Act or a private Act 30 that is in force immediately before the passing of this Act.
 - 2.—(1) Subject to subsection (2), all private Acts enacted before General statute law 1 January 1751 and all local and personal Acts enacted before 1 revision repeal and January 1851 are repealed.

- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to—
- 35 (a) the statutes specified in Schedule 1,

- (b) any statute specified in Schedule 1 to the Statute Law Revision Act 2007 that is in force in the State immediately before the passing of this Act, or
- (c) without prejudice to section 27 of the Interpretation Act 2005 and to section 6, any saving, or any transitional or continuing matter, provided for in respect of a statute repealed by or under any enactment passed prior to the passing of this Act.

Specific repeals.

- **3.**—(1) For ease of reference there is set out—
 - (a) in Parts 1 to 3 of Schedule 2 a list of private Acts, and 10
 - (b) in Part 4 of Schedule 2 a list of local and personal Acts,

that were not wholly repealed before the passing of this Act and are not saved by virtue of section 2(2). For the purposes of this subsection "wholly repealed" includes a statute to which section 2(2)(c) relates.

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(2) The fact that a relevant statute, other than a relevant statute to which paragraph(a) or (b) of section 2(2) relates, is not referred to in $Schedule\ 2$ shall not be read as saving or continuing such relevant statute for any purpose other than as provided for by or referred to in $section\ 2(2)(c)$.

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(3) The inclusion of a statute in *Schedule 2* shall not be taken as evidence that the statute, or any provision of it, was of full force and effect immediately before the passing of this Act.

Assignment of short titles.

- **4**.—In respect of each Act cited in the first column of *Part 1*, *2*, *3* or *4* of *Schedule 1*, each such Act—
 - (a) may be cited by the short title (if any) assigned to it in the fourth column of the Part concerned opposite the mention of that Act in the first column, or
 - (b) may continue to be cited by its short title (if any) referred to in the third column of the Part concerned opposite the 30 mention of that Act in the first column.

Miscellaneous amendments to short titles.

5.—(1) An Act referred to in the Table to this section by reference to its year, session and chapter in the first column and to its short title in the second column is amended to the extent provided for in the third column opposite the mention to the Act concerned. 35 For convenience of reference there is set out in the fourth column, opposite the mention to the Act concerned, the new short title for that Act.

(2) Nothing in this section or the amendments made by it shall be read as affecting the citation of an Act by its short title as set out in the second column of the Table to this section.

6.—(1) This Act does not affect any existing principle or rule of Savings. law or equity or any established jurisdiction, form or course of pleading, practice or procedure or any existing trust, notwithstanding that it may have been in any manner derived from, affirmed or recognised by any statute repealed by this Act.

(2) (a) The repeals by this Act do not affect—

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- (i) the continuance of any body subsisting immediately before the passing of this Act which was incorporated (or otherwise established), confirmed or revived by the grant of a charter or letter patent, and
- (ii) such charter or letter patent, to the extent that it so subsists, together with any amendment to such a charter or letter patent so subsisting and granted or otherwise duly made by or under any enactment or otherwise.
- (b) Nothing in this Act shall be read as affecting section 11(16) of the Local Government Act 2001.
- 50 (3) Where any statute not repealed by this Act has been applied, confirmed, revived or perpetuated by a repealed statute, such application, confirmation, revival or perpetuation is not affected by the repeal.

Short title and collective citation.

7.—(1) This Act may be cited as the Statute Law Revision Act 2009.

(2) The Short Titles Acts 1896 to 2007, sections 4 and 5, this subsection and, in so far as it relates to section 4, Schedule 1 may be cited together as the Short Titles Acts 1896 to 2009.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Introduction

The principal purpose of the Bill is to repeal all Local and Personal Acts enacted prior to 1851 and all Private Statutes enacted prior to 1751, with the exception of a "white list" of Acts that are specifically preserved.

The process leading to the Bill attached to this Memorandum involved a review by the Office of the Attorney General of 3,182 pre 1751 Private Acts and 7,543 pre-1851 Local and Personal Acts. In total 10,725 statutes were analyzed during this phase of the Statute Law Revision Project. Apart from those Acts already repealed as regards Ireland, 8,957 Acts were assessed as not applicable to Ireland. Of the applicable Acts, 138 having been identified as not suitable for repeal as they contain provisions which may have ongoing relevance (these are listed in Schedule 1). The remaining 1,351 Acts have been assessed as suitable for repeal on the basis that they are spent or obsolete (these are listed in Schedule 2). As with the pre-1922 Public and General Acts dealt with by the Statute Law Revision Act 2007, the Private Acts and Local and Personal Acts that did not apply to Ireland will be implicitly repealed by their not being saved and referred to in Schedule 1 to the Bill. This Bill, in tandem with the Statute Law Revision Act 2007, constitutes one of the most extensive statute law revision programmes ever attempted anywhere in the world and for the first time provides a complete list of all primary legislation which is still in force for the periods in question.

Provisions of the Bill

Section 1: Definition.

Section 1 provides definitions of "Local and Personal Act", "Private Act" and "Relevant Statute".

The definitions of the series of statutes are necessary to distinguish them from statutes of a Public General nature which are not affected by this Bill. Note that the definitions relate only to statutes and therefore do not include charters of a local and personal or private nature, and thus such charters are not revoked by the Bill.

Section 2: Statute law revision repeal and saver

Section 2 is the central feature of this Bill. It will provide for a fundamental clarification and simplification of the statute book by expressly repealing all Local and Personal Acts up to and including 1850 and all Private Acts up to and including 1750, with only 2 exceptions:

- 1. Acts listed in *Schedule 1* these will be a list of Local and Personal Acts and Private Acts which are still relevant;
- 2. Pre-1922 Acts that have already been saved by *Schedule 1* of the 2007 Act and remain in force. It is necessary to include reference to the public Acts in order to ensure that the scope of this Bill dovetails with that of the Statute Law Revision Act 2007, particularly as some of the Acts in the 2007 Act were published or listed both as public and private Acts.

Section 2(2)(c) merely saves any transitional or continuing provision that applies to any Act that has already been repealed prior to the present Bill.

Section 3: Specific repeals.

Section 3 provides, for information purposes, a list of all statutes repealed by section 2.

This section lists the specific Acts identified in the course of the review as being unnecessary or as having ceased to be in force. However, the section is not a repealing section, as the repeal is effected by *section 2*.

Section 4: Assignment of short titles.

Section 4 will assign short titles to any Act that is saved by section 2, which does not already have a short title.

Section 5: Miscellaneous amendments to short titles.

Section 5 makes provision for the amendment of any unconventional or inappropriate short titles in respect of Acts saved by section 2, in order to facilitate the citation of those Acts.

Section 6: Savings.

Section 6 provides for standard savings clauses. For clarity, as with the Statute Law Revision Act 2007, reference has also been inserted to the "application" of statutes to the State, in order to ensure that the saver clause is wide enough to preserve statutes which have been applied to Ireland by statutes repealed by this Bill.

Subsection (2) of this Section is designed to preserve the status of bodies which may have been established by a charter made consequent on a statute which is being repealed by this Act.

Section 7: Short title and collective citation.

Section 7 provides for a short title and collective citations. This is a standard provision and is based on section 10 of the 2007 Act.

Schedule 1

Schedule 1 provides a list of statutes which will remain in force following the enactment of the Bill (together with those listed in the 2007 Act).

Each part of *Schedule 1* lists the Acts which it is considered are not appropriate for repeal at this time and are being retained in force specifically.

Schedule 1 is based on the fact that no Local and Personal Act of Great Britain passed between 1797 and 1800 has been found to be applicable to Ireland.

Schedule 2

Schedule 2 lists the Acts specifically repealed by the Bill. They will be Acts which, while applicable to Ireland, have been identified in the course of the review as appropriate for repeal because they have ceased to be in force or have become unnecessary. They are not saved by the saver in section 2(2) and thus will cease to be in force following enactment of this Bill. Other Local and Personal Acts and Private Acts that do not relate to Ireland or have only a tenuous connection with Ireland will not be included in Schedule 2 but will be impliedly repealed by virtue of the general repeal in section 2. Accordingly, this approach (also adopted in the Statute Law Revision Act 2007) will improve clarity as to the repeals relevant to Ireland and provide greater transparency with respect to relevant repeals.

Financial Implications

There are no Exchequer costs, staffing or other implications flowing from the enactment of the Bill, and the enactment of the Bill will produce savings in legal and business costs overall.
