Leasuithe Amendments

SECTION 1

1. In page 7, between lines 21 and 22, to insert the following subsection:

“(2) The amendment to the National Minimum Wage Act 2000 effected by *section 13* does not affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred—

(a) under that Act, or

(b) under any contract of employment entered into before the coming into operation of this Act and to which that Act applied.”

SECTION 2

2. In page 7, before section 2, to insert the following new section:

“Car pooling
arrangements.

2.—The Minister for Finance shall establish an official vehicle pooling scheme for both serving and former office holders eligible to be supplied with official vehicles, for the purpose of ensuring that such persons are as far as practicable supplied with a vehicle from a vehicle pool.”

3. In page 7, before section 2, to insert the following new section:

“Taxation of certain
bonuses.

2.—For so long as a particular credit institution is participating in the eligible liabilities guarantee scheme, any bonus paid by that institution to its officers, employees or contractors shall be liable to an income tax rate (without any deductions or allowances) of 50 per cent.”

4. In page 7, before section 2, to insert the following new section:

“Examination of
certain bonuses.

2.—The Minister for Finance shall, as soon as may be after the passing of this Act, prepare and lay before Dáil Éireann a report on options available for special and time-limited measures to impose a 50 per cent tax or levy on bonuses paid by any credit institution that is participating in the eligible liabilities guarantee scheme.”

5. In page 9, before section 7, to insert the following new section:

“Public service pay cap.

7.—Notwithstanding the Act of 2009, the maximum annual remuneration to be afforded to any public service officeholder including the Taoiseach or a Minister, shall be €190,000.”.

“(d) in the case of a Minister of State, a 45 per cent reduction of remuneration in lieu of a reduction of 10 per cent of remuneration; and

(e) in the case of a TD, a 19 per cent reduction of remuneration; and

(f) in the case of a Senator, a 8.6 per cent reduction of remuneration.”.

10. In page 10, before section 8, to insert the following new section:

“8.—Notwithstanding the Act of 2009, the maximum annual remuneration to be afforded to any public servant or employee in a semi-state body excluding the office holders under *section 7*, shall be €100,000.”.
