

AN BILLE UM FHÁIL PHOIBLÍ, 2012 PUBLIC PROCUREMENT BILL 2012

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Purpose of Bill

The purpose of the Bill is to ensure that social benefits are given a central and crucial role in the assessment of any public tender or any other public procurement process.

Provisions of Bill

Section 1 provides that where any public body is procuring goods or services, it shall in its process of assessment allocate not less than 33 per cent of the assessment to a consideration of the social benefits of the particular tender.

Social benefits include the extent to which the tender or proposal would create employment.

Section 2 defines public body widely to include statutory bodies or those with majority State funding.

Section 3 is a standard provision.

Financial and regulatory implications

Any modest cost to the State arising from the Bill in cases where a tender which is not the lowest cost tender is chosen will be likely to be offset by the social benefits flowing from the Bill including increased employment.
