Leasuithe Amendments

*Government amendments are denoted by an asterisk

- 1. In page 3, to delete line 26 and substitute the following:
 - "(a) the provision of health services without charge as outlined in section 2 of the Health (Amendment) Act 1996,".

- **2.** In page 4, lines 4 and 5, to delete "specified in section 67 of the Act of 1970" and substitute "and dental, optical and aural appliances".

- **3.** In page 4, line 6, after "service," to insert "as provided for in the services provided by section 2 of the Health (Amendment) Act 1996,".
 - —Senators David Cullinane, Trevor Ó Clochartaigh, Kathryn Reilly.
- **4.** In page 5, between lines 7 and 8, to insert the following:

"Personal Advocates

- 5. Provisions for a personal advocacy service shall be made for each applicant to the Scheme, who resides in an institution and in respect of whom a determination has been made by the Minister that she is eligible under the Scheme, regardless of her capacity.".

- **5.** In page 5, between lines 14 and 15, to insert the following:
 - "(2) That within 1 month of enactment of this legislation the Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission will independently verify, in a report laid before the Houses of the Oireachtas, that the legislation does indeed fully and faithfully implement the relevant recommendations contained within the Magdalen Commission Report on the establishment of an *ex-gratia* Scheme and related matters for the benefit of those women who were admitted to and worked in the Magdalen Laundries, authored by Mr Justice John Quirke and published in May 2013."
