#### "Report on substitute consent

- 23. The Minister shall, within 18 months of the passing of this Act, lay a report before both Houses of the Oireachtas outlining—
  - (a) the number of applications for substitute consent received in the preceding 18 month period which were made and the number granted,
  - (b) any impacts identified in respect of other planning applications, and
  - (c) the relevant exceptional circumstance in respect of each successful application.".

14. In page 14, between lines 34 and 35, to insert the following:

## "Report on implications of Act

- 23. The Minister shall, within 6 months of the passing of this Act, lay a report before both Houses of the Oireachtas outlining the implications or impact of this legislation in respect of:
  - (a) the powers of local authorities in respect of the substitute consent process;
  - (b) the appropriate consideration of Local Development Plans in planning;
  - (c) public consultation in respect of planning;
  - (d) the right of the public to participate in environmental decision making as provided for under the Aarhus Convention.".
