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An Act to amend Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 600 of 2001) to provide for exemptions from planning permission for certain categories of public art murals where such work has artistic or cultural merit, has the permission of the owner of the building or structure on which it is displayed, is not a commercial advertisement and does not conflict with the Equal Status Acts.

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Be it enacted by the Oireachtas as follows:

Definitions

1. In this Act—

“artistic or cultural merit” means where any public art mural falls within the definition of “arts” set out in section 2 of the Arts Act 2003;

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“commercial advertisement” means any form of advertising or marketing of products for sale commercially including product placement or endorsement, consistent with section 2 of the Consumer Protection Act 2007;

“public art mural” means any intentionally painted or drawn work of expression located on any building or structure in a public place that has artistic or cultural merit.

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Amendment of Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 600 of 2001)

2. The Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 (S.I. No. 600 of 2001) are amended in Part 1 of Schedule 2 by the insertion of the following class after Class 12:

“Public art murals on any building or other structure

CLASS 12a

Such public art murals must have artistic or cultural merit; must have the permission of the owner of the building or structure or land on which it is displayed; must not be commercial advertisements; must not be erected during an electoral period as set out in the Electoral Reform Act

This exemption does not apply to listed or protected structures or a building or structure in an Architectural Conservation Area or Special Amenity Area Order. Public Art Murals on such buildings or structures can only be carried out in pursuance of a permission granted

3. This Act may be cited as Public Art Mural (Exempted Development) Act 2026.
