Dear Ted,

I refer to your letter of 12 October last in which the Public Accounts Committee sought additional information on allowances in the education sector.

In response to your specific queries I have attached a schedule of the allowances in the same format as the one sent to you on 12 October last along with a number of appendices containing further information.

In broad terms the sector can be divided into:

- the school sector
- the institute of technology sector
- the university sector, and
- the VEC sector.

The overall pay bill inclusive of allowances for these four areas is €5.116 billion. Of this overall figure, allowances, however defined, account in aggregate for some €639 million or 12.5% of the overall pay allocation. Allowances paid to teachers account for some €616 million which equates to 16% of the overall teacher pay bill of €3.83 billion.

Allowances paid elsewhere in the Education sector amount to some €23 million which equates to 1.79% of that aspect of the overall pay bill of €1.286 billion.

Specifically in relation to teachers, it should be noted that the vast majority of teachers are in receipt of at least two allowances (Qualifications and Supervision & Substitution) with many more teachers in receipt of a combination of differing allowances depending on whether they fulfil a management function within the school, or whether they qualify for one of the other allowances detailed in our business cases for example Teaching through Irish.

There are 58,000 whole-time equivalent teachers in the system and as already alluded to allowances are paid in various combinations to virtually all of these teachers.

Accordingly, the average overall percentage of gross pay made up by allowances will be different in nearly every case. With this in mind and for the purposes of clarity, I

attach at Appendix A a number of demonstrative examples of teachers pay incorporating various allowances and displaying the overall percentage of pay that is made up of allowances in these cases.

In respect of teachers, I have also attached a number of further appendices containing information in response to the specific questions posed in your letter of 12 October as follows:

- Appendix B – the number of teachers who hold multiple allowances;
- Appendix C – a table showing the average of allowances as a percentage of teachers pay;

In respect of Question 3 regarding staff in receipt of multiple allowances, the maximum payment that was made to any individual teacher by way of allowances in 2011 was €55,439.

I also attach a revised version of the schedule of allowances that were submitted on the 12<sup>th</sup> October and which include further information in relation to the date of commencement of certain allowances.

I have also included a table detailing information in respect of the allowances paid to staff employed in this Department.

While information was sought from Universities, Institutes and VECs in respect of the specific questions posed by the Committee it has not been possible to provide specific information for these employers in respect of Questions 3 and 4 in the available time.
