# Vote 19: Justice and Equality

### Update

The Vote reference was changed from Vote 19 to Vote 24 in 2012.

The estimate and provisional expenditure for 2012 have been included for each subhead at **Appendix A**.

# **Vote Summary**

The Justice and Equality vote is one of five votes in the Justice Group of Votes. The others are An Garda Síochána, Prisons, Courts and Property Registration Authority.

The Justice Vote accounts for 16% of gross expenditure in the Justice Vote Group, with An Garda Síochána with 63% of expenditure being the largest vote in the Group.

The expenditure breakdown for the Justice Vote in 2011 was comprised of over 36% in pay and pensions related expenditure, 0.7% in capital and the remainder of 63% in non-pay current expenditure.

There were 2,295 fulltime equivalent employees paid from the Vote at the end of December 2012.

The Justice Vote includes over 60 individual subheads including the administrative areas of the Department, Commissions and Special Inquiries, Legal Aid (Civil and Criminal), Immigration and Asylum, Probation Service, Equality Integration and Disability, Charities and a range of other services including offices and agencies such as the Office of Data Protection Commissioner, Criminal Asserts Bureau, Forensic Science and State Pathology Laboratories, Garda Ombudsman Commission etc.

In line with developments in performance budgeting across the Public Sector, the Department of Justice Vote has been restructured on a programme basis for 2013 under the following seven headings;

- A- Maintain a Secure Ireland
- B- Work for Safe Communities
- C- Facilitate the Provision and Administration of Justice
- D- Promote Equality and Integration
- E- Represent Ireland's Justice Interests Abroad
- F- Contribute to Economic Recovery

The detailed breakdown of the subheads under each of the programmes is at **Appendix B**.

## Other changes since 2011

### Legal Aid Board

The budget for the Legal Aid Board has been rationalised in 2012. The former subhead D.2 Asylum Seekers Task Force – Legal Aid is now reflected as part of the grant-in-aid for the Legal Aid Board.

In addition the budget for the Family Mediation Service has transferred to the Legal Aid Board from the Family Support Agency, which is part of the Department of Children and Youth Affairs.

## Irish Youth Justice Service

Certain functions in relation to the Irish Youth Justice Service (including Children Detention Schools) transferred to the Department of Children and Youth Affairs with effect from 1 January 2012. This involved a budgetary transfer of circa €18 million.

The funding for the Community Programmes which includes Garda Youth Diversion and Young Persons Probations projects is accounted for under the Justice and Equality Vote.

# **EU Presidency**

An allocation of €1.2164 million was made available in 2012 and a further €2.020 million in 2013 in relation to the Departments responsibilities under the EU Presidency.

### Personal Insolvency Service

A new subhead for this service was established in 2012.

A specific budget of €7.5 million was set aside in 2013 for the establishment and operation of the new service. The break-down between pay and non-pay is €4.8 million and €2.7 million respectively.

It is anticipated that the new service will having a staffing level of 91 when fully operational.

# Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission

In anticipation of the enactment of the legislation for the new body to replace the Equality Authority and Human Rights Commission, there is a combined allocation for the two bodies reflected in the estimates for 2013.

## **Equality Tribunal**

Responsibility for the Equality Tribunal together with related staff and budget resources have transferred to the Department of Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2013.

This move reflects the rationalisation of the industrial relations/employee rights institutions - Labour Court, Labour Relations Commission, Employee Appeals

Tribunal, National Employment Rights Authority and Equality Tribunal into single agency under the Department of Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation.

# Office of the State Pathologist

Initial development of the Office of the State Pathologist facilities at a site owned by Dublin City Council at Marino had been progressed as an exchequer funded project through a joint venture between the Department and Dublin City Council (DCC). The objective was that a new state of the art laboratory would provide facilities for the State Pathologist and the Dublin Coroner.

The contract for the development was awarded to Michael McNamara and Company by DCC with construction commencing in early 2010. On 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2010 NAMA appointed a receiver to Michael McNamara and Company. As a result, all construction work on the new laboratory ceased and this gave rise to complex legal, public procurement and other considerations. The Department of Justice and Equality has contributed almost €2.8 million to the project.

Under the current capital envelope, there was insufficient funding available to restart the project at Marino through exchequer funded capital. As a result, other options to recommence the project have been examined including the completion of the build under a Public Private Partnership arrangement. Although initially included in the PPP, after further consultation with the NDFA and DCC, it was decided that this was not a viable option and it would be difficult to attract attention from the market given the specialised and complex nature of the build.

It is also the case that the partially completed early stage structure in Marino had deteriorated due to weathering to a point where it was unstable and represented a health and safety risk. As children had also been trespassing on the site this was a particular concern. Advice was received that the structure should be demolished and this has now been completed under the auspices of DCC.

An alternative proposal is now being pursued which is to utilise the former Whitehall Garda Station as a site for the development of the State Laboratory.

Subject to further assessment of the suitability of the site and a full analysis of the likely costs involved, this option may be the best way to ensure that the current highly unsatisfactory State Pathology and Coroners facilities are replaced at the least cost to the State in the shortest time period.

DCC retains in the region of €792,730 from funding allocated to the original project including the remainder of a security bond paid by the Project Bonds Man.

# <u>Chapter 15: Lease of Accommodation for a Probation Service</u> <u>Project</u>

# <u>Update</u>

The expenditure incurred on the project to date remains at just over €2 million which includes refurbishment, professional fees, VAT on the creation of the lease, rent and property management charges. The Department ceased making rent payments from September 2011 on the basis that it could not continue to expend public money on premises that the State could not use, and further, has an

obligation to try to recoup money already expended. Receivers were appointed in February 2012.

As set out in the Comptroller and Auditor General's Report, the Department relied on the advices of the Chief State Solicitor's Office in relation to the signing of the Lease on the premises at Wolfe Tone Street. The Comptroller and Auditor General has found that it is reasonable for the Department to have done so.

The status of the Lease remains in dispute between the Department and the Landlords/Receiver and the architect for the Landlords/Receiver. Public discussion of the facts of the case would prejudice negotiations and any litigation that may be issued by either the State against the Landlords and/or architect, or by the Landlords against the State.

As regards the project itself, from January 2013 the main activities of the Bridge Project take place in the Probation Service Offices in Dublin 1 where Probation Officers assigned to work with Bridge are also located. The Community Employment Scheme which is attached to the Bridge project operates from Ballybough Community Centre with this arrangement due to be reviewed at the end of August 2013.
