Vote 22: Courts Service

The Courts Service is single programme Vote the purpose of which is to:

Manage the Courts and Support the Judiciary

The Courts Service Vote represents one of five votes in the Justice Group of Votes. The others are The Department of Justice, An Garda Síochána, The Irish Prisons Service and the Property Registration Authority.

The Courts Service funding for 2013 accounts for 5% (€104.959m) of gross expenditure funding in the Justice Vote Group.

The expenditure outturn for 2013 can be broken down as follows:

•	Pay	47% (€49m)
•	Non Pay *	31% (€ 32.889m)
	Courthouse Capital and	2% (€2.5m)
	PPP Costs	19% (€20.2m)

^{*} Non Pay includes ICT Capital of €5.6m

There were 927 fulltime equivalent employees paid from the Courts Service Vote at the end of December 2013.

Similar to all Government Departments / Agencies the Courts Service has seen significant reductions in funding over the last six years. When compared to 2008 cuts have been applied across all headings as follows:

Pay

 Non Pay Current
 - 18% (€10.7m)
 - 44% (€19.3m)

Capital - 73% (€25.6m) Both Courthouse and ICT Capital

(Note: the above figures exclude the PPP provision which only commenced in 2010).

During the same period fee income increased by €4.0m (11%)

Courts Fee income represents a significant element of our Vote and reduces the cost of the running the Court Service to the Exchequer. There has been a €21.5m (104%) increase in the level of fee income generated in 2013 compared to 2003.

Latest Expenditure Figures

The latest expenditure figures to October 2014 for the Courts Service are provided at **Appendix B** below.

It is projected that a balanced budget will be achieved for 2014 through a self financing technical supplementary estimate from surplus receipts, the details of which are being finalised with the Department of Justice & Equality and the Department of Public Expenditure & Reform.

Up to Date Developments

The Courts Service continues to bring about a range of transformational changes and initiatives which delivered both savings and improved productivity and efficiency. Recent developments include:

- Court of Appeal Putting appropriate resources and structures in place for the new Court of Appeal.
- Insolvency Service of Ireland Working with the Insolvency Service in the development of appropriate Civil Case Management System
- Implementation of the Fines (Payment and Recovery) Act 2014 –
 Implementing the provisions of the Act
- PPP Bundle Working with the Department of Justice Equality & Reform, the Office of Public Work and the National Development Finance Agency in relation to the Courts PPP Bundle
- Completion of the Combined Court offices Reducing the number of court offices from 62 to 33.
- Rationalisation of court venues Reducing the number of venues from 267 to 85.

I welcome the opportunity to expand on any of the above initiatives at our meeting on the 20th November next.
