What is OBA?

Online Behavioural Advertising (OBA) is a form of targeted advertising which monitors the behaviour of individuals online and shows individuals advertisements based on information collected


How does OBA work?

Collection of personal information online

Allocated an "Interest Segment" based on online behaviour

Ads displayed on the basis of your Interest Segment

How is Personal Information Collected Online



Example of OBA: Interest-based Targeting

Basic Targeting



Ads targeting visitors of a hotels' website

OBA



Ads targeting visitors of a hotel's website who have recently visited websites for spas in the area

Targeted advertising and social media
