## The CER's Role

- Economic regulator of Irish Water in the provision of public water and wastewater services
- Protect interests of customers of Irish Water
- Approve Irish Water's proposed Water Charges Plan
  - → Revenue (Capital & Operational Expenditure)
  - → Tariffs
  - → Connection Charges
- Approve Irish Water's Codes of Practice & Terms and Conditions in accordance with Irish Water Customer Handbook
- Dispute resolution
- Monitor Irish Water's performance
- Provide support to the Public Water Forum (MoU)
- Cooperation with the Environmental Protection Agency (MoU)



- Two revenue reviews to date (Oct 2014/2016, 2017/2018)
- Review of Irish Water' capital investment plan
  - Approach to plan development, balancing and prioritisation
  - Capital programme management and governance
  - Costing of the submissions
- CER determines allowed revenue for defined targets & outcomes incorporating efficiency challenge
- · Random sample of project and programme audits to assess:
  - Key drivers and obligations
  - Approach to development of solutions/interventions
  - Cost estimation
  - Project delivery
  - Governance



- CER allowed total capital expenditure of €1.152bn (2017/18)
  - As part of Irish Water's capital planning process certain projects were tagged as 'mandatory' including to address ECJ list
  - 38 agglomerations listed in the EC's referral of Ireland to the ECJ
  - 29 agglomerations requiring work at end 2016
  - Based on Irish Water revenue review submission to the CER (Aug 2016):
    - €243m in 2017-2018
    - €623m in the five year period 2017-2021
    - €286m in the period post 2021
- CER will monitor Irish Water's delivery against targeted outcomes/outputs for the allowed expenditure
