3 reasons for start up

- 1. Lost one teacher in both schools: from 4 to 3 & 3 to 2
- 2. Declining population post 1980s
- Leader Partnership, CEBs and CES.

GAA club built indoor complex in 1989 for IR350,000. It cleared all debt in a few years by voluntary fund raising. A realisation dawned of a new capacity.

GAA club is representative, competitive, fearless & caring.



Results- Today



- Schools: Dunhill from 3 to 9. Fenor from 2 to 17.
- Population: Up 25% from 1993
- **Employment**: 250 jobs created since 2000.
- Enterprise Centre: Currently 36 enterprises / 75 jobs
- International Recognition:
 - Copper Coast EU & UNESCO Global Geopark
 - Integrated Constructed Wetlands (Ear to the Ground)
 - Fenor Bog
 - Dunhill Castle Robert Le Poher 1174
 - Ireland-Newfoundland Connections (INC)

Against the odds:

- National voluntary shared learning network
- Share ideas, problems, solutions, resources, avoid mistakes, waste, duplication and displacement.
- Identify/ activate dormant resources/better ways
- Provide scaffolding with examples/ tools
- Simplify complex documents, criteria, barriers.
- Develop new pathways to success.

(2019-2022)

- CCJ, GAA, Third Level Education Consortium.
- Target 10 jobs in every community.
- Local task group and facilitator- 6 months timeline.
- Complete assets & opportunities audit report. Stage 1 app.
- Project promoters engage with relevant agencies. Stage 2
- · Job creation, empowerment, capacity building process.

- State partner with communities on regeneration projects.
- Education, employment, housing, health, security, enterprise, food, environment, migrants, sport, creative arts, social and economic cohesion.
- Empower communities to use social capital, build capacity.

- 8. Pilot social enterprise projects with N Ireland. (North / South Body & Leader Partnership)
- 9. Credit Unions provide loan finance for social enterprise. (ILCU)
- 10. "The Enterprising Community" (Purchase & Promote Book)
