




About 56 million abortions took place each year in 2010-2014







There are about 35 abortions for every 1,000 women of childbearing age






Abortion rates are low or declining in developed subregions











Abortion rates vary across countries where abortion is legal on broad grounds

Abortions per 1,000 women 15-49 years old






The abortion rate is similar in countries grouped by legal status






Married women account for the majority of abortions






Abortions are less safe in countries with restrictive abortion laws






About half of women obtaining abortions are 20-29 years old in countries with data




Most women who have had abortions have at least one child






Most abortions are performed by the ninth week of pregnancy






Women report a variety of reasons for obtaining an abortion






Many women report more than one reason for obtaining an abortion






Worldwide, 75 countries allow abortion without restriction as to reason or for socioeconomic reasons
