Wednesday proposal no. 2 – Statements by Leaders on the Report of the Commission of Investigation into Mother and Baby Homes

- Shall not exceed 110 minutes, and shall be confined to a single round, to which the following arrangements shall apply:
 - (i) the Taoiseach, the Tánaiste and the Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth shall be called upon in that order and their statements shall not exceed 15 minutes (in the case of the Taoiseach) and 10 minutes each (in the case of the Tánaiste and the Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth); and
 - (ii) following the Government contributions, the statement of the leader of Sinn Féin shall not exceed 15 minutes, followed by the leaders or a representative of the Labour Party, Social Democrats, Solidarity-People Before Profit, the Regional Group, the Rural Independent Group and the Independent Group, who shall be called upon in that order, and whose statements shall not exceed 10 minutes each

Wednesday proposal no. 3 – Statements and Q&A on Health and Covid-19

- Shall not exceed 200 minutes, and shall be confined to two rounds, to which the following arrangements shall apply:
 - (i) each speaking round shall not exceed 100 minutes, and shall be arranged as agreed by Order of the Dáil of 30th July, 2020, for 100 minutes, provided that members may use their allotted time

on the second round for a combination of statement and questions and answers, or questions and answers only; and
(ii) all members may share time
