Wednesday proposal no. 5 - Consumer Protection (Regulation of Retail Credit and Credit Servicing Firms) Bill 2021 (Report and Final Stages)

 - (i) any division claimed on the business proposal for the Financial Motion shall be taken on the conclusion of proceedings on the Consumer Protection (Regulation of Retail Credit and Credit Servicing Firms) Bill 2021;
 - (ii) the Financial Motion shall be taken on the conclusion of the Consumer Protection (Regulation of Retail Credit and Credit Servicing Firms) Bill 2021, or on the conclusion of any division claimed on the business proposal for the Financial Motion, as appropriate, and shall, if not previously concluded, be brought to a conclusion after 140 ~~75~~ minutes, with arrangements in accordance with those agreed by Order of the Dáil of 30th July, 2020, for 135 minutes, save that the Labour Party, Social Democrats, People Before Profit-Solidarity, the Rural Independent Group and the Independent Group shall each have an additional minute and members may share time ~~the contributions shall be as follows:~~
 - (i) ~~the opening speech of a Minister or Minister of State and the speech of a representative of Sinn Féin shall not exceed 15 minutes in each case;~~
 - (ii) ~~the speeches of representatives of all other parties and groups in Opposition shall not exceed 7.5 minutes in each case; and~~
 - (iii) ~~members may share time~~
