WAIVER REQUEST ON ILLEGAL ISRAELI SETTLEMENTS DIVESTMENT BILL 2023

- The Bill was read a second time on 17 February 2024, the requisite nine months having elapsed since the agreement of a Government amendment to defer the second reading of the Bill.
- On 28 February 2024, the Business Committee received a request from the Bill's sponsor, Deputy John Brady, for a waiver of pre-Committee Stage scrutiny. On 29 February, the Business Committee received correspondence from the relevant Committee (namely the Committee on Finance and Public Expenditure and Reform, and Taoiseach) in support of the waiver request.
- On 4 March, correspondence was received from the Minister for Finance setting out his views that the Bill warranted pre-Committee Stage scrutiny by the relevant Committee.
- The Business Committee considered the above correspondence at its meeting on 8 March 2024.
 Consensus not having been reached on Deputy Brady's request, the waiver was not granted.
 Accordingly, pre-Committee Stage scrutiny must be completed before the Order for Committee can be made [Standing Orders 178 and 180].
- Deputies Pádraig Mac Lochlainn, Duncan Smith, Cian O'Callaghan, Richard Boyd Barrett, Denis
 Naughten and Thomas Pringle dissented from the decision to refuse the waiver, on the basis
 that the established practice of the Business Committee is to accept the recommendation of
 the relevant Committee in relation to requests for waivers.
