- On the nomination of a Taoiseach for appointment by the President, the Dáil shall, unless it otherwise orders, stand suspended until either 5 p.m. or four hours after the conclusion of the proceedings, whichever is the later
- Aside from this proposal, all divisions this week to be by manual roll-call

Article 13.1.2: Nomination of other members of the Government

- To conclude within 1 hour and 42 minutes
- Speaking arrangements as follows:
 - Taoiseach's speech 10 minutes
 - speeches by representatives of other Government parties, Sinn Féin, the Labour Party, Social Democrats, People-Before-Profit-Solidarity, the Regional Group, the Rural Independent Group and the Independent Group – 10 minutes per party or group
 - o contributions by non-aligned members 2 minutes
 - Members may share time
- On the conclusion of the proceedings on the motion, the Dáil shall adjourn until 2 p.m. on Wednesday, whereupon the arrangements for the taking of business on Wednesday and Thursday shall be determined by the House on a proposal by the Government Chief Whip
