• General Practitioner (GP) services and in particular Out of Hours GP services - the Committee noted that an interim solution is being examined in respect of Out of Hours GP services for

the Midlands Region. It was agreed to request details regarding overall funding and measures being taken to address gaps and shortfalls in GP service provision, including out of hours GP care, to include details on staff numbers and buildings provided for GP services by the HSE; and

• Funding of Voluntary Disability Services Agencies - the Committee requests an information note to include regional distinctions and the criteria in each Community Health Organisation for the provision of services to children.

It was also agreed to defer consideration of Business of the Committee on 2 February 2023 to facilitate attendance by Members at a joint sitting of the Dáil and the Seanad.

It was agreed to add the provision of modular units in respect of Direct Provision and International Protection accommodation to the agenda for the meeting with the Department of Children, Equality, Disability and Youth on 16 February 2023 -

It was agreed to re-schedule a meeting with An Bord Pleanála provisionally scheduled for 23 February 2023 to a later date. It was also agreed to schedule a meeting on 23 February 2023 with the Central Bank and to request representatives from the Office of the Revenue Commissioners and Department of Finance.

It was agreed to add the following to the Committee's work programme:

- Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and request representatives from the Departments of the Environment, Climate and Communications and Public Expenditure and Reform.
