In relation to the Financial Statements of Beaumont Hospital, it was agreed to write to the Board of the Hospital to request the following information:

- how many staff have received overpayments;
- a breakdown of the staff grades concerned, the amount paid to each grade and over which time period;
- how much of these monies has been retrieved and over what time period;
- what plan is in place to recoup the outstanding amounts.

The Committee also referred to the fact that the Beaumont Hospital Information System (BHIS) will be inoperable beyond 31 December 2025, and due to delays experienced to date, the timeline to implement its replacement poses a significant risk to effective operation of the Hospital. It was agreed to write to the hospital to express the Committee's concern about this and to request an outline of the measures it is taking in order to address this, the project timeline and how it expects to work to that timeline.

It was also agreed to request the following information in relation to non-compliant procurement:

- a breakdown of what kinds of services and goods were procured, a breakdown of the value of the goods procured and a breakdown of the suppliers.
- a note explaining why non-compliant procurement has been consistently high at the hospital.
