#### 1. Introduction

The Committee on Members' Interests of Seanad Éireann (the "Committee") was appointed by an order of Seanad Éireann on 25 October, 2007, pursuant to Standing Order 90 of the Standing Orders relative to Public Business of Seanad Éireann and section 8 of the Ethics in Public Office Act 1995 (the "1995 Act") as amended by the Standards in Public Office Act 2001 (the "2001 Act") (collectively referred herein after as "the Acts")

One of the functions of the Committee is to carry out investigations where a complaint is referred or made to the Committee, or if the Committee considers it appropriate to do so. The Committee has the power to investigate if a member has contravened section 5 or 7 of the 1995 Act as amended or has done a specified act as defined in section 4 of the 2001 Act.

#### 2. Complaint received

On 5 August 2010 the Clerk of Seanad Éireann received a complaint from Mr. Martin O'Sullivan in relation to a statement made by Senator Mullen. The Clerk of Seanad Éireann referred the complaint to the Committee pursuant to section 8 of the Acts.

### 3. Considerations of the complaint by the Committee

The Committee met on 9 August 2010 and commenced its investigation by seeking a statement from Senator Mullen in response to the complaint received. A copy of the complaint received was forwarded to Senator Mullen. Senator Mullen responded by way of letter dated 12 August 2010. The Committee met on 23 August 2010 and considered the complaint and Senator Mullen's response.

### 4. Findings of the Committee

The Committee considered whether the Senator's actions constituted a "specified act" within the meaning of the Acts. Having duly considered the complaint and the response received from Senator Mullen, the Committee determined that the Senator has not done a specified act within the meaning of the Acts, that there were no reasonable grounds for the complaint in the manner contemplated in the Acts and consequently that no action will be taken against the Senator.

The Committee agreed to write to the Complainant, Senator Mullen and the Clerk of the Seanad Éireann and to attach a copy of its report and findings.
