Please note: Apprentices registered after 2013 are still within the minimum period of apprenticeship so are not included in the above figures.

Due to the nature of apprenticeship not all complete within the minimum time-frame of 4 years and are still progressing. Also some apprentices who emigrated during the recession are returning to complete their apprenticeships. Consequently completion rates above may improve.
