EXPENDITURE BENCHMARK RULE (STEP 1)

The Reference Rate (%) is a cap on annual corrected growth of public spending.

Discretionary Revenue Measures / non-indexation of tax system (+€600m)



Pre-Committed Expenditure (Budget 2018 carry over, public sector pay, demographic costs, capital expenditure) (-€2.3bn)



Rainy Day Fund contribution (-€500m)



Net fiscal space to be allocated, Budget 2019 (=€800m)



Extra available fiscal space under Expenditure Benchmark (~ €900m)
