**168.** “That Dáil Éireann:

notes:

- that Ireland’s network of regional and local roads is almost 91,000 kilometres in length, accounts for 94 per cent of Ireland’s road network and carries about 54 per cent of all road traffic;
- that the local and regional road network serves as the main connection between homes and businesses in much of Ireland, including Dublin and other urban areas, and plays a vital role in balanced regional economic development;
- that according to the latest National Oversight and Audit Commission, almost 70 per cent of regional roads have structural or surface defects and that ten per cent or more of local primary roads were structurally distressed in 12 local authorities;
- that well-maintained and good quality local and regional roads facilitate strong links between and among communities;
- that the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport has, on average over the past five years, provided local councils with less than half the amount of funding that is deemed necessary to maintain roads in a steady state condition;
- that repeated incidences of flooding and other extreme weather events have caused considerable damage to many local and regional roads;
- that many local authorities have too few outdoor council staff and have not been granted sufficient resources to hire additional staff;



- the importance of the speedy delivery of the planned upgrading of our national road network, for both the economy and a more balanced spatial distribution; and
- the considerable safety concerns arising from roads with structural or surface defects and that the presence of such defects increases the frequency of road collisions;

recognises that:

- the Programme for a Partnership Government commits to increasing the capital budget for regional and local roads by approximately 50 per cent, which has yet to be delivered; and
- the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport has estimated, in its Strategic Framework for Investment in Land Transport, that an annual investment of €580 million is required to maintain the current regional and local road network, €163 million more than has been allocated this year; and

calls on the Government to:

- significantly increase the regional and local roads budget in the context of the Capital Investment Plan 2016-2021;
- publish a full response to the findings of the National Oversight and Audit Commission, with a detailed plan to address the issues and defects identified in this report, within three months;
- review the management of funds at local authority levels to ensure that funds are being used in the most efficient and effective manner possible and provide additional administrative supports where they are needed; and

    - the person has failed to perform the functions of the office with due diligence and effectiveness; and
    - the person’s removal from office would, in the Government’s opinion, be in the best interests of An Garda Síochána; and
  - on notifying under section 12(1) a person who holds the office of Garda Commissioner that the Government intends to consider removing him or her from office, the Government may immediately suspend the person from

duty;

further notes that Commissioner O’Sullivan has stated that she plans to continue in her position, even if there is a Dáil vote of no confidence in her; and

calls on the Government to:

- use the powers available to them under the Garda Síochána Act 2005 to immediately suspend and then remove from office the current Garda Commissioner, Nóirín O’Sullivan;
- independently investigate the involvement of members of senior Garda management in alleged malpractice and/or corruption;
- urgently review the situations in which people may be convicted for certain crimes based on the word of a Garda Superintendent; and

- recognises that the murder of innocent civilians by the various factions may amount to war crimes and should be punished accordingly;

calls for:

- all sides in the conflict to abide by international human rights law and put an end to all bombing of Syria;

- the Irish Government to formally make known to all governments that have engaged in the bombing of Syria, the Irish people’s revulsion of their actions in Syria;
- increased humanitarian aid to be deployed to refugee camps to assist those fleeing Syria, Afghanistan and Iraq, and specific efforts to be made by the Irish Government to accommodate families and children in particular from this war-torn region; and
- renewed efforts to be made to broker peace in the country by taking a neutral position and by condemning all acts of violence, including all forms of bombings by all parties to the conflict; and

- is appalled by the reported use of chemical weapons in Khan Sheikun, Syria on 4th April, 2017, which killed dozens of people, including children;
- reiterates that United Nations Security Council (UNSC) Resolutions 2118 (2013) and 2209 (2015), which condemned in the strongest terms the use of any toxic chemical as a weapon in Syria, affirmed that the use of chemical weapons constituted a serious violation of international law and stressed that those responsible for the use of such weapons must be held accountable;
- recognises that the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) and the United Nations Joint Investigative Mechanism (JIM), was mandated by the UNSC to identify to the greatest extent feasible individuals, entities, groups or governments who were perpetrators, organisers, sponsors or otherwise involved in the use of chemicals as weapons, including chlorine or any other toxic chemical, in Syria;
- notes the allegations of the use of Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) listed chemical weapons and/or toxic chemicals as weapons in Syria received by the JIM from member states between December 2015 and August 2016 include sarin (13), sulphur mustard (12), VX (4), chlorine (41) and other toxic chemicals or agents (61);
- recalls the findings of the JIM in its August 2016 report into eight cases of suspected chlorine attacks and one sulphur mustard attack, which occurred between April 2014 and September 2015, which accuses both the Syrian army and other actors, including ISIS/Da’esh, of carrying out these attacks;
- condemns these chemical weapons attacks without reservation;
- welcomes that the OPCW is investigating the incident in Khan Sheikun under the on-going mandate of the OPCW Fact-Finding Mission;

- notes that the OPCW has stated that it cannot and will not release information about an on-going investigation; that this policy exists to preserve the integrity of the investigatory process and its results, as well as to ensure the safety and security of the OPCW experts and personnel involved;
- states its disgust at the complete lack of adherence to the norms of international law by the warring parties in Syria;
- condemns all direct and indirect foreign involvement in the conflict; and
- welcomes that the Irish Government has continued to donate to humanitarian efforts and relief programmes in Syria, and in refugee camps in neighbouring countries, and its pledge, on 5th April, 2017, of a further €25 million to help the Syrian humanitarian effort in 2017;

calls for:

- the UNSC to immediately adopt criteria to curtail members from using a veto when there are serious concerns that war crimes and crimes against humanity may have been committed, and to work towards further reform of the UNSC, including the abolishment of permanent positions and the ability of any country to have a veto;
- the UNSC to refer the situation in Syria to the International Criminal Court and to ensure that anyone who is suspected of committing war crimes is prosecuted;
- the Irish Government to formally make known to the Syrian government, and the governments of all countries directly or indirectly involved in the war, of the Irish people's disgust at suspected war crimes in the conflict, and to condemn these actions and the continued loss of life in Syria without reservation;
- the Syrian government to unconditionally abide by its obligations as a State Party to the CWC and as a member state of the OPCW;
- the Irish Government to assist in renewed efforts to establish a ceasefire in the conflict and efforts to establish a peace process; and
- the Irish Government to fulfil all its humanitarian and aid commitments to Syria and Syrian refugees, including the resettlement and relocation of Syrian refugees in Ireland; and

- the OPCW to carry out a full investigation to formally determine the use of chemical weapons in Idlib, Syria;
- the UNSC to immediately adopt criteria to curtail members from using the veto where there are serious concerns that war crimes and crimes against humanity may have been committed;
- the UNSC to refer the situation in Syria to the International Criminal Court;
- accountability for war crimes, such as the use of chemical weapons;
- those suspected of committing such heinous crimes to be investigated fully and to face the full rigours of the law if found guilty;
- the Irish Government to formally make known to the Syrian government our horror at their actions and condemn them without reservation;
- continued support for the people of Syria and to honour the commitment as outlined in the Programme for Partnership Government to 'continue to play an active role at the European Union Foreign Affairs Council, the OSCE and through the UN, in seeking diplomatic resolutions to crises and conflict, with particular reference to Syria'; and

- acknowledges the Climate Change Advisory Council’s first report which states that achievement of the national mitigation objective, of an 80 per cent reduction in emissions compared to 1990 levels by 2050, will require a major societal and economic transformation;
- acknowledges the wide consensus internationally that society’s transformation away from fossil fuels must ensure fairness and justice for, and the participation of, the groups and communities most affected by the scale of the change required;
- agrees, in relation to transition and the workforce, with the principle expressed in the preamble to the Paris Agreement, namely that countries should, in their actions under the Agreement, take into account ‘the imperatives of a just transition of the workforce and the creation of decent work and quality jobs in accordance with nationally defined development priorities’;

- notes the emergence in many countries of initiatives, policy and legislative proposals to give effect to the concept of a just transition;
- further notes the proposal at European Union (EU) level for a directive to enhance cost-effective emission reductions, low-carbon investments and which promotes just transition funding, to support local communities and workers in regions impacted most strongly by the ongoing transition to decarbonised economies; and
- agrees, in relation to Ireland, that in addition to effecting its greenhouse gas reductions in the manner required by the Paris Agreement, that a national-level commitment to pursue a just transition derives from the State's obligation to achieve the 'national transition objective' as defined in the Climate Action and Low Carbon Development Act 2015, and in doing so, to have regard, under section 3 of that Act, to 'climate justice';

further acknowledges:

- the 2016 Programme for a Partnership Government, which states that 'climate change is the global challenge of our generation, and requires radical and ambitious thinking to respond to a changing environment' and that Ireland is to be 'repositioned to give global leadership in this area';
- that peat industry workers have a proud history of providing energy sovereignty to the Irish nation and many are the third and fourth generations of their families working on the bogs since the 1940s;
- that 1,700 jobs are directly dependent on the peat industry in peat plants, seasonal work in extracting peat, retail, professional and briquette factories, and a further 2,500 indirect jobs are dependent including Bord na Móna support departments, external suppliers and contractors; and
- that the Public Service Obligation (PSO) levy, which provides a circa €115.5 million to €123 million subsidy to the peat plants, will end in the first half of 2020 and the urgent need to use such public funds to ensure a just transition for workers currently working in the industry; and

calls on the Government to:

- replace the PSO on peat fired generation from 2019 with a just transition levy, which will re-allocate this €120 million to a new replacement levy that will fund the retraining and social protection of workers and communities affected by the closure of the peat industry;
- conduct a proactively managed, planned decline of the peat industry, in conjunction with Bord na Móna and peat industry workers, and ensure a just transition for workers and dependent communities into new areas of low-carbon employment;
- seek inclusion for the Irish peat industry in just transition funding at EU level;
- consult with communities and workers to explore investment opportunities that will enable midland regions, dependent on employment in the peat industry, to find renewable economic livelihoods with a long-term future in line with the 2016 Programme for a Partnership Government which states 'as part of the transition to a low carbon society, that citizens and communities are active participants in the transition, with robust public and stakeholder engagement in energy policy and effective community consultation on energy infrastructure developments';
- set up a Just Transition Commission that will facilitate talks between trade unions, employer organisations, affected communities and climate transition experts to

oversee and deliver a durable, sustainable and fair transition to a low carbon economy for workers in the Irish fossil-fuel sector;

- work with all affected parties to support the peat industry and its workforce in moving immediately to a low carbon future, as part of an overall long-term plan to end peat extraction for industrial and horticultural use by 2020 as part of a reviewed National Peatlands Strategy; and
- take a decisive lead to create employment in electricity generation, energy storage, community energy, transport infrastructure, energy efficiency and sustainable heating for homes and businesses, and rehabilitation of our bogs and national habitats.” — *Eamon Ryan, Catherine Martin.*

- that the demand for service in the single catheterisation laboratory (cath lab) in the

South East has grown greatly since the inception of the lab and it has now grown beyond the infrastructure committed to it;

- the unacceptable wait times being encountered for outpatient and inpatient care which are seriously detrimental to wellbeing and arise solely because of the lack of an additional cath lab facility on the UHW campus;
- that this risk was recognised by the Health Service Executive (HSE) over several years, with the lack of a second facility identified as a critical risk on the formal HSE risk register;
- that the Programme for a Partnership Government committed to the development of a second cath lab at UHW subject to a favourable recommendation from an independent clinical review;
- the publication of a report entitled '*Independent Clinical Review of Provision of a Second Catheterisation Laboratory at University Hospital Waterford*', otherwise known as the Herity Report;
- that the South East region is the only region nationally without a 24/7 cardiac care service; and
- that multiple worldwide clinical assessments of primary emergency coronary angioplasty and stenting for Sinus Tachycardia elevated heart attack have been demonstrated to only be effective if carried out soon after the first presentation of symptoms of heart attack;

further notes:

- that the Herity Report calls for the current limited hours provision of Primary Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (PPCI) at UHW cease entirely;
- that this would result in all emergency cardiac patients in the South East having to travel to hospitals in Cork or Dublin for treatment;
- the inadequacy of the current air ambulance service to meet the needs of patients in the South East;
- the poor road infrastructure between UHW and Cork University Hospital; and
- the need to enhance ambulance services and response times;

calls on the Government to:

- immediately initiate a second independent review into the provision of cardiac care in the South East; and
- ensure that work on the review commences within six weeks of the passing of this motion and that a speedy conclusion is reached, cognisant of the sensitive issues involved;

agrees that the terms of reference for this regional review will be:

- agreed by all parties and groups in this House prior to commencement and framed in the context of existing regional policy;
- based on the need for 24/7 PPCI at UHW to ensure safe and accessible emergency cardiac care for the population of the South East;
- based on clinical and medical need and underpinned by the National Clinical Programme and consult widely and appropriately with regional clinicians and

medical experts;

- based on the actual population of the South East and not an arbitrary effective catchment population; and
- cognisant of the range of travel times to hospitals outside the region and not simply the average time; and

further agrees that the review will:

- respect the status of UHW as a regional hospital providing a regional cardiac service;
- identify need and capacity based on the geographical area the hospital serves, namely the population of the South East; and

- Whitaker’s report also cited the Armenian Genocide as meeting the criteria for the UN definition of genocide, defining it as one of the genocides of the 20th century and his report was received and noted by a resolution at the 38th session of the UN’s Sub-Commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities in 1985;
- in 1997, the International Association of Genocide Scholars (IAGS) passed a resolution unanimously recognising the Ottoman massacres of Armenians as genocide and, in 2007, the IAGS passed three different resolutions which were extended to include the Assyrian Genocide and the Pontian and Anatolian Greek Genocide among the affected minorities;
- the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe recognised the Armenian Genocide on 14th May, 2001; and
- on 15th April, 2015, the European Parliament backed a motion acknowledging the killing of 1.5 million Armenians by Ottoman Turkish forces as genocide, after passing



similar motions in 1987, 2000, 2002 and 2005;

recognises:

- that an estimated 1.5 million Armenians were slaughtered in this genocide; and
- the untold suffering and loss that the Armenian people endured in the Armenian Genocide which was carried out between 1915 and 1916; and
