acknowledges that the laws repealed in the Criminal Law (Sexual Offences) Act 1993 that criminalised consensual sexual activity between men:

- were improperly discriminatory, contrary to human dignity and an infringement of personal privacy and autonomy;
- caused multiple harms to those directly and indirectly affected, namely men who engaged in consensual same-sex activities and their families and friends; and
- had a significant chilling effect on progress towards equality for the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Intersex (LGBTI) community, acknowledging in particular the legacy of HIV/AIDS within the context of criminalisation;

further acknowledges the hurt and the harm caused to those who were deterred by those laws from being open and honest about their identity with their family and in society and that this prevented citizens from engaging in civil and political life and deprived society of their full contribution;

offers a sincere apology to individuals convicted of same-sex sexual activity which is now legal;

welcomes the positive progressive measures introduced by successive Governments over the last thirty years and in particular in the 25 years since decriminalisation was introduced by the Criminal Law (Sexual Offences) Act 1993, including *inter alia*:

- the Prohibition of Incitement to Hatred Act 1989;

- there is not a family in the State currently unaffected by the crisis of hospital waiting lists;
- excessive waiting times are an indicator of poor quality of care in a health system because it shows that the system does not have the capacity to meet the demand for the service;
- because of the two-tier health system in the State, long waits also result in unequal access to care, since waiting is a feature of the public system to a much higher degree than it is for private patients;
- there are more than 707,000 people on a waiting list for a medical procedure as of May 2018;
- statistically speaking, one in every seven people is on a waiting list across the State;
- there are 511,904 people on outpatient waiting lists across the State;
- there are 147,387 outpatient appointments outstanding for over a year as of May 2018;
- 79,647 outpatients were on the waiting list for more than 18 months in May 2018, an increase of 29,956 on May of last year;
- there are 78,596 people on inpatient waiting lists across the State;
- 5,929 people are on the inpatient and day-case waiting lists for more than 18 months;
- these people are not numbers, they are living, breathing, feeling people who are on a waiting list because they need medical attention; and
- the Euro Health Consumer Index of 2017 found that Ireland has the worst hospital waiting lists in Europe;

recognises that:

- under the current waiting list system, waiting lists for outpatient appointments, diagnostic tests, day-case and inpatient procedures vary drastically from one public hospital to the next;
- patients do not know where they stand on the list, nor at what speed their list is moving relative to that of other hospitals within reasonable travelling distance;
- people with comparable health concerns can wait very different lengths of time for

assessment and treatment depending on the hospital to which they happen to be initially referred;

- the introduction of an integrated IT system in the Portuguese National Health Service (NHS) helped to achieve new maximum wait times by actively transferring those on the list from hospitals that are failing to meet the target to hospitals that have the ability to offer the service on time;
- the IT model introduced by the Portuguese, alongside greater investment in public hospitals, has delivered significant and sustained reductions in waiting times for surgery since it was first introduced in 2004;
- in the 2013 Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) publication entitled ‘Waiting Time Policies in the Health Sector: What Works?’, described how over five years waiting lists for surgery have decreased in Portugal by almost 35 per cent, the median waiting times by almost 63 per cent and variation across providers is also diminishing; and
- a similar waiting list management system has been proven to work on a smaller scale in the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI) Hospital Group, the result being that they were the only hospital group in the State who managed to reduce their outpatient waiting lists from May 2017 to May 2018, reducing the waiting list by 2,613; and

calls on the Government and the Health Service Executive to:

- urgently move to implement the Sláintecare Report in its entirety;
- introduce a new and single integrated hospital waiting list management IT system as used in the Portuguese NHS and the RCSI Hospital Group;
- properly invest in our public health system to help tackle waiting lists and stop diverting public monies into the hands of private health interests;
- liaise with hospitals and staff to ensure that as many elective diagnostic investigations are being carried out on a weekly basis as is possible, and to determine whether further surgeries can be carried out over weekends;

- the unacceptable wait times being encountered for outpatient and inpatient care which are seriously detrimental to wellbeing and arise solely because of the lack of an additional cath lab facility on the UHW campus;
- that this risk was recognised by the Health Service Executive (HSE) over several years, with the lack of a second facility identified as a critical risk on the formal HSE risk register;
- that the Programme for a Partnership Government committed to the development of a second cath lab at UHW subject to a favourable recommendation from an independent clinical review;

- the publication of a report entitled ‘*Independent Clinical Review of Provision of a Second Catheterisation Laboratory at University Hospital Waterford*’, otherwise known as the Herity Report;
- that the South East region is the only region nationally without a 24/7 cardiac care service; and
- that multiple worldwide clinical assessments of primary emergency coronary angioplasty and stenting for Sinus Tachycardia elevated heart attack have been demonstrated to only be effective if carried out soon after the first presentation of symptoms of heart attack;

further notes:

- that the Herity Report calls for the current limited hours provision of Primary Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (PPCI) at UHW cease entirely;
- that this would result in all emergency cardiac patients in the South East having to travel to hospitals in Cork or Dublin for treatment;
- the inadequacy of the current air ambulance service to meet the needs of patients in the South East;
- the poor road infrastructure between UHW and Cork University Hospital; and
- the need to enhance ambulance services and response times;

calls on the Government to:

- immediately initiate a second independent review into the provision of cardiac care in the South East; and
- ensure that work on the review commences within six weeks of the passing of this motion and that a speedy conclusion is reached, cognisant of the sensitive issues involved;

agrees that the terms of reference for this regional review will be:

- Whitaker’s report also cited the Armenian Genocide as meeting the criteria for the UN definition of genocide, defining it as one of the genocides of the 20th century and his report was received and noted by a resolution at the 38th session of the UN’s Sub-Commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities in 1985;
- in 1997, the International Association of Genocide Scholars (IAGS) passed a resolution unanimously recognising the Ottoman massacres of Armenians as genocide and, in 2007, the IAGS passed three different resolutions which were extended to include the Assyrian Genocide and the Pontian and Anatolian Greek Genocide among the affected minorities;
- the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe recognised the Armenian Genocide on 14th May, 2001; and
- on 15th April, 2015, the European Parliament backed a motion acknowledging the killing of 1.5 million Armenians by Ottoman Turkish forces as genocide, after passing similar motions in 1987, 2000, 2002 and 2005;

recognises:

- that an estimated 1.5 million Armenians were slaughtered in this genocide; and
- the untold suffering and loss that the Armenian people endured in the Armenian Genocide which was carried out between 1915 and 1916; and
