- over 14,000 people signed the recent Barnardos Ireland petition to call for an end to the use of bed and breakfasts and hotels to house homeless children; and
- public opinion is ahead of the political will to end the crisis, and the majority of the public believe that housing is a human right which should be enshrined in the Constitution, according to a recent Amárach poll published on the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights on 10th December; and

calls on the Government to:

- immediately declare a housing emergency and implement the necessary emergency measures to urgently address the crisis;
- hold a referendum on the right to housing in May 2019;
- commit to re-housing families who have been in emergency homeless accommodation, including hubs, for 18 months or more, no later than by the end of quarter 1, 2019;
- commit to re-housing all other families experiencing homelessness by the end of quarter 2, 2019;
- limit the use of hubs and emergency accommodation for families with children to three months maximum;
- increase supports to schools in areas with large populations of homeless families;
- provide free counselling to all families and children experiencing homelessness should they wish to avail of the service;
- increase the number of available emergency beds and single rooms in dry hostels; and

- the Government recognised the urgency of the housing crisis over two years ago and introduced the Rebuilding Ireland - Action Plan for Housing and Homelessness, providing a comprehensive framework for addressing the range of complex issues needing to be addressed across the housing sector;
- the Rebuilding Ireland - Action Plan for Housing and Homelessness is underpinned by over €6 billion in funding to support the delivery of 50,000 new social housing homes and 87,000 other housing supports over the six years 2016 to 2021;
- very significant progress has been made from 2016 to the end of 2018, in partnership with local authorities, Approved Housing Bodies and a range of other delivery partners, with over 72,000 individuals and families having their housing needs met during those three years, over 27,000 of which were supported in 2018 alone, and a further 27,300 households are expected to be supported this year, and this will bring to almost 100,000 the total number of households who will have been assisted under Rebuilding Ireland by the end of 2019;
- the level of progress being made is reflected in social housing waiting lists, which have reduced by 22 per cent, from 91,600 households to 71,858, between 2016 and 2018;
- to date, Rebuilding Ireland has increased the active social housing stock by over 21,200 homes, with some 8,420 of these being delivered in 2018;
- in 2018, over 18,000 new homes were built, a 25 per cent increase on the previous year and the highest number of newly built homes any year this decade, and in addition, more than 2,500 homes were brought out of long-term vacancy, with almost 800 dwellings in unfinished housing developments completed, meaning the number of new homes available for use increased by almost 21,500 in 2018, which does not include the 3,742 bed spaces completed in the student sector in 2018;
- the Government is committed to supporting those single persons, families and their dependents who are experiencing homelessness, and Budget 2019 reflects this commitment, with an increase of 25 per cent in the current spending budget for the provision of homeless services (bringing the total to €146 million for this year);
- the most recent published statistics show there were 9,753 persons in emergency accommodation in the month of December 2018, comprised of 6,194 adults and 3,559 associated dependants, and this represents a reduction of 215 people nationally on the numbers recorded in November;
- in December 2018, there were 111 fewer families and 252 fewer dependants in emergency accommodation than was the case in November, and that for the fifth consecutive month there was a reduction recorded in the number of families presenting to homeless services in the Dublin region;
- 111 families exited emergency accommodation into new homes in Dublin in December 2018, while 72 per cent of families in emergency accommodation in the Dublin region at the end of December had been homeless for less than one year, and through service level agreements with service providers, local authorities are working towards ensuring that exits from homelessness are achieved within six months of entering emergency accommodation;
- while the most recent count of rough sleepers in the Dublin region showed that 156 individuals were recorded sleeping rough, which was an increase on the numbers recorded in March 2018, there was a decrease of 28 on the number of persons



recorded as sleeping rough during the equivalent winter count in 2017;

- the number of beds in use for single adults has risen from 2,000 beds at the end of 2017 to 2,300 beds in the Dublin region at the end of 2018, and all of these beds are supported temporary accommodation where single individuals and couples receive the accommodation and health supports that they need, with those presenting as homeless being matched to the best available accommodation, according to their needs, and emergency accommodation capacity fluctuates and is dictated by demand, with extra contingency beds being put in place during periods of adverse weather;
- increased outreach and prevention measures are working and will continue to be supported by the Government, including through the Homeless Housing Assistance Payment (HAP) Placefinder Service, and 19 HAP Placefinders are now in place and to the end of quarter 3 2018, in excess of 5,300 households have been supported through Homeless HAP nationally, 4,350 of whom were in the Dublin region;
- the Government will continue to provide more suitable temporary accommodation to homeless families, increasing the number of family hubs to 26 at the end of 2018, with a total capacity for over 600 families, and with further hubs spaces to be added in 2019, as hubs provide a greater level of stability than is possible in hotel accommodation, with the capacity to provide appropriate play-space, cooking and laundry facilities, communal recreation space, while move-on options to long-term independent living are identified and secured;
- the most recently available performance reports show 3,752 adults exiting homelessness into independent tenancies in the nine-month period between January and September 2018, and this represents an increase of 431 (13 per cent) on the 3,321 exits recorded over the same period in 2017;
- an error was discovered in 2018, whereby households who were not in emergency accommodation had been counted in the emergency accommodation numbers, and this error was rectified and reports on the matter were published; and
- extensive supports are also provided to families experiencing homelessness by the Department of Children and Youth Affairs, and the Child and Family Agency, Tusla, and supports include:
  - a special provision under the existing Community Childcare Subvention Programme of free childcare for children from homeless families;
  - Tusla's School Completion Programme, which places an emphasis on children from homeless families;
  - Home School Community Liaison Scheme co-ordinators proactively engaging with parents from homeless families to provide supports and assistance where required; and
  - children in homeless accommodation being prioritised within the School Completion Programme for services such as breakfast and homework clubs; and

further acknowledges that:

- Housing First is delivering permanent housing solutions for rough sleepers and long-term users of emergency accommodation, and by the end of 2018, the Dublin Region Housing First Service had created Housing First tenancies for 243 unique individuals, of whom 86 per cent have successfully retained their homes, and the Housing First National Implementation Plan 2018-2021 contains targets for each local authority,

- with an overall national target of an additional 663 tenancies to be delivered by 2021;
- a high-level Homelessness Inter-Agency Group has been established, with representation from the Department of Justice and Equality, the Department of Health, the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection, the Department of Education and Skills, local authorities, Tusla and the Health Service Executive, and a report from this Group was submitted to Cabinet in June 2018, and a range of recommendations are now being implemented including better co-ordination of responses, particularly in the areas of health, justice and family homelessness;
  - the provision of accommodation to those in the international protection process and the provision of domestic violence refuges, and reporting on progress in these areas, will continue to be prioritised by the Minister for Justice and Equality and the Minister for Children and Youth Affairs/Tusla, respectively; and
  - the Eighth Report of the Convention on the Constitution recommended that the State should progressively realise economic, social and cultural rights, including the right to housing, subject to maximum available resources, by inserting such a right into the Constitution of Ireland, and the Convention’s recommendation raises substantial questions, including for example, the suitability or otherwise of the Constitution of Ireland as a vehicle for providing for detailed rights in this area, the possible cost, and the fact that there is already power by legislation to confer rights and determine expenditure via primary and secondary legislation and an elected and accountable Government and Oireachtas, and for these reasons the issue of the right to housing was referred, for further consideration, to the appropriate Oireachtas Committee, the Joint Committee on Finance, Public Expenditure and Reform, and Taoiseach, in October 2017.” — *An tAire Tithíochta, Pleanála agus Rialtais Áitiúil*.

- recent revelations by the Office of the Director of Corporate Enforcement (ODCE) in relation to the potential data breaches within Independent News and Media have once again highlighted the need to examine the operation of media outlets in Ireland; and

calls for the urgent establishment of a fully independent commission on the future of media in Ireland comprising a broad spectrum of representatives from relevant backgrounds, including consumers of media, with a view to making recommendations to nurture and sustain a healthy Irish news media where:

- the broad diversity of views and of cultural interests prevalent in society is reflected through the activities of media businesses and the public service broadcaster, including their editorial ethos, content and sources; and
- there is a healthy spread of ownership and control of media businesses, with no person or undertaking holding excessive interests within a sector or across different sectors of media business.” — *Catherine Murphy, Róisín Shortall, Brendan Howlin, Joan Burton, Alan Kelly, Jan O'Sullivan, Willie Penrose, Brendan Ryan, Sean Sherlock.*

## 215. “That Dáil Éireann:

notes:

- the increasing importance of digital communications platforms such as Facebook and Google during national elections and referendum campaigns;
- the Cambridge Analytica scandal which highlighted how outside interests can use online tracking and advertising tools to influence national elections;
- that advertising on such platforms is not regulated under existing election advertising rules;
- the work of the Transparent Referendum Initiative in recording the source and number of adverts carried on such platforms during the recent referendum campaign;
- how both Facebook and Google decided, with just three weeks to go to polling day, to amend their own rules to restrict the carrying of advertising in relation to the referendum for the remainder of the campaign;
- the need to understand whether the volume of advertising from overseas was a factor in those decisions; and
- the opportunity that exists to set a precedent on the need for transparency surrounding such advertising;

calls on the relevant social media companies to:

- work with the Transparent Referendum Initiative to provide details on the volume and value of referendum advertising that was carried on their platforms during the recent referendum to repeal the Eighth Amendment of the Constitution of Ireland; and
- publish such data in a prompt manner and in accordance with the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) European Directive; and

calls on the Government to commit to finalising the necessary legislation to ensure there is proper regulation of such online election advertising in the future, including mechanisms to provide full transparency on the level and source of such advertising expenditure.” — *Eamon Ryan, Catherine Martin*.

**216.** “That Dáil Éireann:

notes that:

- with 34.4 million air passengers in Ireland in 2017, there has been an increase in the use of air travel over many years;
- there is a probable impact of increased traffic at Irish airports due to the United Kingdom’s decision to leave the European Union (EU); and
- the Dublin Airport Authority (DAA) is now planning for up to 50 million plus passengers per annum at Dublin Airport alone;

further notes that:

- EU Directives, planning conditions and environmental impact studies have developed over the past 20-25 years, leading to stricter noise conditions being imposed on developments by airports;
- Dublin Airport runway 10R 28L currently has night flights and with a planning condition for no night flights to take place on the new northern runway 10L 28R, all night flights would be directed onto the older runway;
- over 250 European airports, including London Heathrow and Frankfurt, have longstanding restrictions on night flights;
- homes recording noise levels of 63 decibels are to be offered insulation and those affected by 69 decibels are to be offered relocation via a voluntary buy-out scheme;
- the community of St. Margaret’s The Ward and St. Margaret’s received a level of insulation for their homes and schools following a public period of negotiation with the then Aer Rianta, and this level of insulation has not been reviewed or upgraded since;
- the new northern runway and indeed the existing runway have impacted and will impact further on the value of the properties within certain noise contours, and will also impact on the health of the residents and the environment of the local communities; and
- local residents believe, however that the economic importance of Dublin Airport and the necessity for growth can co-exist with the local community, with proper insulation and sound barrier technologies installed, reasonable noise controls and a voluntary buy-out scheme for those who decide they need to leave; and

calls on the Government to:

- restrict air travel between the hours of 11.30 p.m. and 5 a.m. on all runways;

- instruct the Environmental Protection Agency to carry out independent noise pollution investigations in a selection of homes affected by noise pollution from runway 10R 28L and the proposed new northern runway 10L 28R;
- examine European best practice for insulation and ensure that all homes receive this level of support;
- ensure that the homes affected by the older 10R 28L runway are provided with the same level of insulation as the homes affected by the new northern runway 10L 28R;
- direct the DAA and other airport authorities to offer either improved insulation or a voluntary buy-out scheme to those homes affected, and for insulation and the voluntary buy-out option to be reviewed/upgraded every 5-7 years; and
- bring forward the noise pollution legislation promised but never enacted by previous Governments.” — *Thomas P. Broughan, Clare Daly.*

**217.** “That Dáil Éireann:

notes that the Health Service Executive (HSE) submitted an audit report to the Government on 11th June, 2018, confirming that, in general, Section 39 organisations had maintained alignment with HSE pay scales during the Financial Emergency Measures in the Public Interest (FEMPI) cuts and that pay cuts averaged around 4.66 per cent since 2010;

further notes that:

- a private members’ motion was agreed by Dáil Éireann in January 2018, calling on the Government to undertake such an audit and analysis, and to commit to reimbursement of any cuts found;
- Section 39 organisations are in agreement with staff and unions that pay restoration is due to staff as per the Lansdowne Road Agreement (Public Sector Stability Agreement 2018-2020) but, in general, they are unable to meet these increased pay demands from their own restricted funds;
- the Labour Court recommendation LCR21609 on 20th November, 2017, between the Irish Wheelchair Association (IWA) and the Services, Industrial, Professional and Technical Union (SIPTU) confirmed the alignment between the IWA pay scales and the HSE;
- the Labour Court recommendation LCR21609 on 20th November, 2017, also criticised the HSE’s administrative requirement for the IWA and SIPTU to engage in the industrial relations process;
- industrial action is due to take place across Section 39 services on 18th September, having been deferred since February to allow for talks;
- funding has still not been provided to Section 39 organisations to restore pay in line with HSE pay rates;
- delays are merely increasing the amounts due to staff incrementally and creating distress and unease for staff and services;
- due to lack of pay restoration, Section 39 organisations find themselves under extreme pressure in relation to recruitment and retention of staff; and

- the work of Section 39 organisations and their staff is of importance, and that industrial action for the large numbers of vulnerable service-users would be a catastrophe; and

calls on the Government to:

- immediately implement the motion as passed by Dáil Éireann on 17th January, 2018, calling for restoration of pay for staff of Section 39 organisations; and
- instruct the HSE to immediately provide the additional funding to the Section 39 organisations found in the HSE report, of which a copy was submitted to the Government on 11th June, 2018, to meet pay restoration obligations to staff.” — *Thomas P. Broughan, Thomas Pringle, Clare Daly, Mick Wallace, Maureen O’Sullivan, Joan Collins, Catherine Connolly.*

**218.** “That Dáil Éireann:

recognises that:

- post offices provide crucial economic, administrative and social services to communities all around Ireland, especially to those in rural and isolated areas;
- many citizens depend on post offices in order to access basic State services, including social welfare payments and passport applications, as well as key financial services including insurance, banking and foreign exchange;
- this Government and the previous Government have stripped vital State services away from rural communities, including rural transport links, support for small schools, and rural Garda stations;
- previous post office closures took place as the result of population decline and not as the result of a pre-meditated programme to drastically reduce the number of post offices that are present in rural areas;
- technological and societal changes have presented significant challenges to the existent post office business model, and that significant change is required in order to ensure the viability of the An Post network;
- the Programme for a Partnership Government committed to revitalising the An Post network through the introduction of new services; and
- there has been a Post Office Network Business Development Group since 2014, which made a final report to the Government in January 2016 that made 23 recommendations, which have yet to be acted upon;

notes that:

- it is the Government’s responsibility to provide equality of access to important services to all citizens;
- following the recent decision by An Post to circulate retirement packages to hundreds of postmasters and postmistresses, 159 have elected to take their well-deserved retirements;
- it is An Post’s intention that wherever a postmaster or postmistress has elected to retire, that post office will close, leaving communities without access to critical post office services;
- other European countries have already extended Public Service Obligation (PSO)

payments for the purpose of maintaining post office outlets in areas where they would be otherwise financially unviable; and

- the proposed changes to a 15 kilometre radius will place an intolerable burden on the elderly and most vulnerable in our communities, particularly those without access to private or public transport; and

calls on the Government to:

- guarantee the current An Post network to ensure that all citizens of Ireland have access to this important service by introducing a new PSO payment for post offices, based on models in the United Kingdom;
- immediately roll out new services, as recommended by the Post Office Network Business Development Group and An Post's own strategy, to ensure the financial viability of the entire An Post network; and

agrees that membership of the new, one-year Citizens' Assembly will consist of:

- a chairperson, to be appointed by An Taoiseach;
- a minimum of 66 citizens, randomly selected so as to be broadly representative of Irish society and who are entitled to vote in a referendum and in local authority elections;
- one member from each of the political parties of the Northern Ireland Assembly;
- one member appointed by each political party/grouping of the Oireachtas; and
- substitutes, who may be appointed by each political party/grouping, and who will be entitled to full participation rights, including the right to vote; and

further agrees that:

- the Citizens' Assembly-
  - will agree its own rules of procedure to ensure effective conduct of its business which will be done in as economical a manner as possible;



- will give appropriate regard to the conventions and clauses contained within the Good Friday and St. Andrews' Agreements;
  - will present an interim report to the Houses of the Oireachtas, including its recommendations, within two months of completing its deliberations; and
  - may invite and accept submissions from interested bodies and members of the public, and will seek advice and guidance whenever necessary to aid its members in their deliberations;
- all matters before the Citizens' Assembly will be determined by a majority of the votes cast by members present;
- the chairperson will have the casting vote in the event of a hung vote; and
- An Taoiseach will provide, to the Houses of the Oireachtas, a response to the recommendation/s of the Citizens' Assembly within one month of receiving the interim and final reports, and will indicate a timeframe as to when the holding of any related referendum is envisaged.” — *Aengus Ó Snodaigh, Gerry Adams, John Brady, Pat Buckley, Seán Crowe, David Cullinane, Pearse Doherty, Dessie Ellis, Martin J.
