- the forcible displacement of civilians in Gaza and the aerial bombardment of routes used by displaced civilians;
- the targeting of critical infrastructure in Gaza and the orders from the Israeli Defence Forces to evacuate hospitals, placing further strain on a healthcare system on the brink of collapse;

notes with extreme concern:

- that the Israeli Government's actions amount to collective punishment of the 2.3 million Palestinians in Gaza, which is a violation of international law, in particular the Geneva Conventions;
- the actions of the Israeli Government in recent weeks and the rhetoric of their political leaders indicating the intention to escalate which will lead to more death and destruction in Gaza;
- that Human Rights Watch and Amnesty International have confirmed the use of white phosphorous by Israel in civilian areas of Gaza;
- that there are approximately 50,000 pregnant women in Gaza according to the United Nations Population Fund who lack access to essential maternal healthcare, and that for the approximately 150 women per day giving birth in Gaza there is no access to clean water;
- that the Israeli Government has bombed at least three refugee camps;
- that while some humanitarian aid is now entering Gaza, it falls far short of the 100 trucks per day of humanitarian aid which international aid agencies estimate is necessary to meet the basic humanitarian needs of the people of Gaza;
- that the Rafah Crossing has only been opened to allow an estimated 500 foreign nationals and dual citizens to leave Gaza, and many who wish to leave or are eligible to leave, are not able to make the journey due to the aerial bombardment and destruction of roads;
- the failure of many in the international community to hold Israel to account for their actions in breach of international law and the unwillingness of many countries/entities, including the United States, the United Kingdom and the Council of the European Union, to call for a ceasefire;
- that the Council of the European Union has failed to be consistent in seeking application of international law, and by its double standards, has engaged in acts of gross hypocrisy and moral failure;
- that the Israeli Government has refused to recognise the authority of the International Criminal Court;

- that the actions of the Israeli Government have been described as a ‘text-book case of genocide’ by prominent human rights lawyer and former Director of the New York Office of the United Nations High Commissioner on Human Rights Craig Mokhiber;
- that there has been significant repression by Israeli authorities of demonstrations expressing solidarity with the Palestinian people;
- that there has been significant repression of demonstrations expressing solidarity with the Palestinian people across Europe and such repression violates Article 10 and Article 11 of the European Convention on Human Rights;

further notes:

- that Article 33 of the Geneva Conventions prohibits collective punishment;
- that Article 51 of Additional Protocol 1 of the Geneva Conventions requires the protection of the civilian population and prohibits indiscriminate attacks which result in civilian injury or loss of life;
- that the rights and obligations under the United Nations Charter apply equally to all, including the obligation to pursue peace;
- the United Nations General Assembly Resolution ES-10/21;
- that the Seanad has passed the Control of Economic Activity (Occupied Territories) Bill 2018, and the legislation is awaiting passage in Dáil Éireann;
- that since the Oslo Accords were signed, there are now four times as many illegal Israeli settlements;
- that the United Nations Special Rapporteur for the situation of human rights in the Palestinian territory occupied since 1967, Michael Lynk, has stated that ‘apartheid is being practiced by Israel in the occupied Palestinian territory’;
- the 2022 report from Amnesty International entitled ‘Israel’s Apartheid Against Palestinians: Cruel System of Domination and Crime Against Humanity’;

- there are 12,827 people living in emergency accommodation according to the latest figures from the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage;
- many communities face a dearth of shared public and community facilities such as community meeting spaces, creative work/exhibition space, and facilities for young people;
- there is a significant deficit in the number of construction workers available to undertake extensive retrofitting and regeneration projects;
- the delay in assessing home adaptation grants means that some housing can be unnecessarily left vacant when waiting;

recognises that:

- the State ought to play a core role in the renovation and repurposing of vacant and derelict buildings for housing and community use;
- the renovation, retrofitting and repurposing of vacant sites and buildings requires extensive investment, technical knowledge and significant labour that can only be executed by local authorities;
- local government is under-resourced and under-funded with respect to acquiring new vacant properties and renovating, repurposing or retrofitting existing vacant State-owned properties;
- the Government has implemented a vacant homes tax which has failed to go far enough to disincentivise vacancy;

calls for:

- reform of the compulsory purchase process to make it easier for local authorities to CPO vacant buildings to bring back into use for either housing or community use;
- a mapping exercise to be carried out to gather a comprehensive picture of all State, semi-State and local authority-owned buildings and sites to identify their current use, if any;
- a dedicated, and simple renewal fund for local authorities for the purpose of bringing back into use vacant and derelict buildings in their local authority area be established;
- each local authority to publish a maximum timeframe for assessing the home adaptation grant;
- the implementation of a timed 'use it or lose it' rule on undeveloped sites/or buildings with planning permission, thus tying the development of land within the local

authority area with the condition of that development, the punitive action being compulsory purchase of the property by the local authority where the owner has failed to undergo the development of the site within a given time period;

- the inclusion of further construction and conservation skills as qualifying skills for the purpose of obtaining the Critical Skills Employment Permit to supplement the deficit in construction workers and specialists in conservation; and
- a guarantee that construction apprentices are afforded at least the national minimum wage to act as an incentive to undertake a career in construction.”
