ARRANGEMENTS FOR BUSINESS FOR
TUESDAY TO WEDNESDAY, 26 - 28 MARCH 2019
(AS AGREED ON 25 MARCH 2019)

Announcement of Business for the Week:

Tuesday's business shall be:

- Item 28, Aircraft Noise (Dublin Airport) Regulation Bill 2018 Report and Final Stages (resumed); and
- Item 7, Regulated Professions (Health and Social Care) (Amendment) Bill 2019 Order for Second Stage and Second Stage.

Private Members' Business shall be Item 211, Motion re Petroleum and Other Minerals Development (Amendment) (Climate Emergency Measures) Bill 2018, selected by Solidarity-People Before Profit.

Wednesday's business shall be:

- Item *a*11, Motion to Instruct the Committee on the Civil Registration Bill 2019;
- Item 29, Statements post European Council meeting of 21st – 22nd March, pursuant to Standing Order 111;
- Item 28, (resumed); and
- Item 30, Civil Registration Bill 2019 Order for Report, Report and Final Stages.

Private Members' Business shall be Item 212, Motion re Agriculture, selected by Fianna Fáil.

Thursday's business shall be:

- Item 11, Motion re Deferred Surrender Order (back from Committee);
- Item *a*1, Sea-Fisheries (Amendment) Bill 2017 [Seanad]; and
- Item 7.

Second Stage of Item 50, Residential Tenancies (Prevention of Family Homelessness) Bill 2018 (Deputy Eoin Ó Broin) shall be debated in the evening slot.

Announcement of Proposed Arrangements for this week's business:

In relation to Wednesday's business, it is proposed that:

- (1) Item *a*11 shall be taken without debate and any division demanded thereon shall be taken immediately; and

- (2) Item 29 shall commence immediately after Taoiseach's Questions and be followed by the suspension of sitting under Standing Order 25(1) for one hour. The Statements shall be brought to a conclusion after 1 hour and 45 minutes, if not previously concluded, with Statements of a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons for parties and groups, or a member nominated in their stead, not exceeding 10 minutes each. A Minister or Minister for State shall take questions for a period not exceeding 20 minutes with a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time.

In relation to Thursday's business, it is proposed that:

1. The Dáil shall sit later than 8.03 p.m. and Topical Issues shall take place on the conclusion of All Stages of Item *a1* or at 5.25 p.m., whichever is the later;
2. Item 11 shall be taken without debate; and
3. The proceedings on Second Stage of Item *a1*, shall, if not previously concluded, be brought to a conclusion after two hours and any division demanded on the conclusion of Second Stage shall be taken immediately. Speeches of a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons for parties or groups, or a member nominated in their stead, shall not exceed 10 minutes each; with 10 minutes for all other members, a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time. Proceedings on Committee and Remaining Stages shall, if not previously concluded, be brought to a conclusion after one hour by one Question, which shall, in relation to amendments, include only those set down or accepted by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine.
