Announcement of Business for the Week:

Tuesday's business shall be:

- Item 10, Motion re Service by the Defence Forces with the United Nations in 2017 and 2018 Annual Report (Referral to Committee);
- Item 10a, Motion re PQ Rota Swop (Departments of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and Justice and Equality);
- Item 11, Motion re Agreement Amending the Ireland US Preclearance Agreement;
- Item 28, Statements on GP Contractual Reform;
- Item 29, Greyhound Racing Bill 2018 [Seanad] Order for Report, Report and Final Stages; and
- Item 30, National Surplus (Reserve Fund for Exceptional Contingencies) Bill 2018 Order for Report, Report and Final Stages.

Private Members' Business shall be Item 55, Civil Liability and Courts (Amendment) Bill 2019 Second Stage, selected by Fianna Fáil.

Wednesday's business shall be:

- Item 31, Statements post European Council meeting of 10th April, pursuant to Standing Order 111; and
- Item 32, Statements on the New Children's Hospital Independent Review of Escalation in Costs.

Private Members' Business shall be Item 218, Motion re Transport, selected by the Social Democrats-Green Party Group.

Thursday's business shall be:

- Item 33, Statements on Youth Homelessness (to adjourn, if not previously concluded);
- Item a1, Aircraft Noise (Dublin Airport) Regulation Bill 2018 Amendments from the Seanad (*subject to the Seanad having completing Committee and Remaining Stages*); and
- Item 34, Statements on Ireland's position on the Future of Europe.

Announcement of Proposed Arrangements for this week's business:

In relation to Tuesday's business, it is proposed that:

1. The Dáil shall sit later than 10.00 p.m. and shall adjourn on the conclusion of Private Members' Business;
2. Item 10, Motion re Service by the Defence Forces with the United Nations in 2017 and 2018 Annual Report (Referral to Committee) and Item 10a, Motion re PQ Rota Swop, shall be taken without debate;
3. Item 11, Motion re Agreement Amending the Ireland US Preclearance Agreement, shall be brought to a conclusion within 45 minutes. Speeches shall be confined to a single round for a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons for parties and groups, or a member nominated in their stead, of 5 minutes each with a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time;
4. Item 28, Statements on GP Contractual Reform, shall conclude within 53 minutes. Statements shall be confined to a single round for a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons for parties and groups, or a member nominated in their stead, of 6 minutes each with a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time; and
5. Item 55, Civil Liability and Courts (Amendment) Bill 2019, Second Stage, shall commence on the conclusion of the Statements on GP Contractual Reform, or at 8.00 p.m., whichever is the later, and shall conclude within two hours.

In relation to Wednesday's business, it is proposed that:

1. The Dáil shall sit later than 10.15 p.m. and shall adjourn on the conclusion of Item 32, Statements on the Report on the Independent Review of Escalation in National Children's Hospital Costs or at 10.46 p.m., whichever is the later. The suspension of sitting under Standing Order 25(1) shall take place on the conclusion of Questions to the Minister for Finance, until 2.00 p.m., and shall be followed by Leaders' Questions;
2. Item 31, Statements post European Council meeting of 10th April, pursuant to Standing Order 111, shall commence immediately after Taoiseach's Questions and be followed by Topical Issues, and shall be brought to a conclusion after 105 minutes, if not previously concluded. Statements shall be confined to a single round for a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons for parties and groups, or a member nominated in their stead, of 10 minutes each. A Minister or Minister of State shall take questions for a period not exceeding 20 minutes with a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time; and

3. Item 32, Statements on the New Children's Hospital Independent Review of Escalation in Costs, shall conclude within 2 hours 26 minutes. The Statements shall be confined to a single round by a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons of parties or groups, or a member nominated in their stead, of 10 minutes each. Following the Statements, each party or group shall have 8 minutes each for Questions and Answers with a 10 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time.

In relation to Thursday's business, it is proposed that:

1. The Dáil shall sit at 9.30 a.m. to take Item 33, Statements on Youth Homelessness. If the Statements conclude before 10.30 a.m., the Dáil shall suspend until 10.30 a.m. If the Statements have not concluded at 10.30 a.m., the Statements shall resume on the conclusion of Item 34, Statements on Ireland's position on the Future of Europe, if Item 34 has concluded before 5.15 p.m. Statements of a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons, or a member nominated in their stead, shall not exceed 10 minutes each with 5 minutes for all other members, a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time;
2. Item 34, Statements on Ireland's position on the Future of Europe shall commence not later than 4.30 p.m. and shall conclude within 45 minutes. Statements shall be confined to a single round for a Minister or Minister of State and the main spokespersons for parties and groups, or a member nominated in their stead, of 5 minutes each with a 5 minute response from a Minister or Minister of State, and all members may share time; and
3. No Private Members' Bill shall be taken under Standing Order 140A and no Committee Report shall be taken under Standing Order 91(2). The Dáil on its rising shall adjourn until 2.00 p.m. on Wednesday 8 May 2019.
